

NOTE: The report shall have a length between 20 and 30 pages, excluding bibliography.

BIBLIOGRAPHY

The bibliography will be cited following the norms recommended by the *American Chemical Society*, a style that implies including the title of the articles when quoting the bibliography.

The following sections explain the style and punctuation characteristics prescribed to write the bibliographic references of the main documents.

Magazine article:

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; Author2; Author3; etc., at least for the first ten, and add et al. for the rest). Title of the article. Abbreviated article of the magazine (in *italics*), year (in **bold**), volume of the magazine (in *italics*), first page-last page of the article.

Example:

Doe, J. S.; Smith, J.; Roe, P. Compounds with Strange Bonding Motifs. *J. Am. Chem. Soc.* **1968**, *90*, 8234–8241.

Article of an online magazine:

The same style is used in articles of printed magazines, adding the words "[En l nia]", "[En l nea]" or "[Online]", according to the language used to write the report, after the abbreviated title of the magazine. Other elements shall be added such as the DOI (if available), the online publication date (if it shows) and also "available at: URL and date in which the document was consulted".

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; Author2; Author3; Author4; Author5; Author6; Author7; Author8; Author9; Author10; et al.). Title of the article. *Abbreviated title of the magazine*. [Online] **year**, *volume of the amgazine*, first page-last page of the article. DOI: Published online: date. available at: URL (consulted date).

Examples:

Huckaba, A. J.; Sharpe, E. A. and Delcamp, J. H. Photocatalytic Reduction of CO₂ with Re-Pyridyl-NHCs. *Inorg. Chem.* [Online] **2016**, *55* (2), 682–690. DOI: 10.1021/acs.inorgchem.5b02015. Published online: December, 24 2015. Available at: <http://pubs.acs.org/doi/abs/10.1021/acs.inorgchem.5b02015> (consulted December 28, 2015).

Book:

(book with no editor)

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; author2; Author3; etc.). *Title of the book*, edition; series (if any); editor: place of publication, year.

Example:

Smith, A. B. *Textbook of Chemistry*; American Chemical Society: Washington, DC, 1972.

(book with editor)

Title of the book, edition; Surname(s), Name initials (Editor1, Editor2, etc.), eds.; series (if any); editor: place of publication, year.

Example:

Functional Supramolecular Architectures: for Organic Electronics and Nanotechnology; Samor , P., Cacialli, F., eds.; Wiley-VCH: Weinheim, 2011.

Online book:

The same style is used for printed books, adding the words "[En línea]", "[En línea]" or "[Online]" after the title of the book. Besides, the URL and the date the document was consulted shall also be added. (*book without editor*)

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; Author2; Author3; etc.). *Title of the book* [online]; edition, series (if any); editor: place of publication, year; volume, pages. URL (consulting date).

Example:

Avendaño, C.; Menéndez, J. C. *Medicinal Chemistry of Anticancer Drugs* [online]; Elsevier: Amsterdam; Boston, 2008; p. 229-249. <http://www.sciencedirect.com/science/book/9780444528247> (consulted November 27, 2016).

Chapter of the book:

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; author2; Author3; etc.). Chapter title. In: *Title of the book*; Editor1, Editor2, etc., eds.; edition; series (if any); editor: place of publication, year; volume, pages.

Example:

Braga, A. A. C.; Ujaque, G.; Maseras, F. Mechanism of Palladium-Catalyzed CrossCoupling Reactions. In: *Computational Modeling for Homogeneous and Enzymatic Catalysis: A Knowledge-Base for Designing Efficient Catalysts*; Morokuma, K.; Musaev, D. G., eds.; Wiley-VCH: Weinheim, 2008; p. 109-130.

Chapter of an online book:

Surname(s), Name initials (Author1; author2; Author3; etc.). Chapter title. In: *Book title* [online]; Editor1, Editor2, etc., eds.; edition; series (if any); editor: place of publication, year; volume, pages. URL (consulted date).

Example:

Andrews, D. L. Introduction to molecular spectroscopy and photophysics. In: *Molecular photophysics and spectroscopy* [en línea]; Andrews, D. L., ed.; Morgan & Claypool Publishers: Bristol, 2014; p. 1-3. <http://iopscience.iop.org/book/978-1-627-05288-7/chapter/bk978-1-627-05288-7ch1> (consulted November 26, 2016).

Websites:

Author (if any). Title of the website. (Consulted date), other additional information (if necessary).

Examples:

Molecule of the Week (MOTW) <https://www.acs.org/content/acs/en/molecule-of-the-week.html> (consulted November 25, 2016).

The ACS Style Guide. <http://pubs.acs.org/series/styleguide> (consulted November 25, 2016).

International Union of Pure and Applied Chemistry Home Page. <https://iupac.org/> (consulted November 25, 2016).

Article of online encyclopedia:

Author(s). Title of the article. *Title of the encyclopedia* [online]; editor(s), year of online publication; volume (if any), pages. URL (consulted date).

Example:

Verpoorte, R. Alkaloids. *Encyclopedia of analytical science* [online]; Paul Worsfold, Alan Townshend, Colin Poole, 2005; 56-61. <http://www.sciencedirect.com/science/referenceworks/9780123693976> (consulted November 28, 2016).

Other sources

Thesis

Surname(s), Name initials (Author). Title of the thesis. Thesis, Degree and Master's degree final project. Type of document, academic institution it is submitted to, place, date (it can be year, month and year or month, day and year).

Examples:

Mäckel, H. Capturing the Spectra of Silicon Solar Cells. Ph.D. Thesis, The Australian National University, December 2004.

Pitarch Jarque, J. Química de coordinación de macrociclos con unidades 1H-Pirazol. Doctoral thesis, Universitat de València, Burjassot, 2016.

Online thesis:

Surname(s), Name initials (Author). Thesis title. Thesis, Degree and master's degree final project. Type of document [online], academic institution it is submitted to, place, date (it can be year, month and year or month, day and year). URL and date in which the document was consulted).

Example:

Lozano, P. C. Studies on the Ion-Droplet Mixed Regime in Colloid Thrusters. Ph.D. Doctoral thesis [online], Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Cambridge, MA, January 2003. <http://ssl.mit.edu/files/website/theses/PhD-2003-Lozano-TovarPaulo.pdf> (consulted November 27, 2016).

Patents:

Surname(s), Name initials (Title of the patent 1; Title of the patent 2; etc.). Title of the patent. Number of patent, date (of publication).

Examples:

BASF SE; Research Triangle Institute. Removing sulphur oxides from a fluid stream. European patent (Eur. Pat. Appl.) EP2819766 (B1), May 18, 2016.

University of Valencia. SOD-imitating metal complexes. European patent (Eur. Pat. Appl.) EP2492270 (B1), March 09, 2016.
