The Universitat de València, through the Chair of Philosophy and Citizenship “Josep Lluís Blasco Estellés”, announces the Second “Càtedra Blasco” Essay Prize with the following rules:

R U L E S

- 1.** This prize is open to any essay that fits in with one of the subject matters of the aforementioned chair: philosophy, politics, sociology, etc. The length of the essay will be no less than 150 pages (DIN A4) and no more than 250 pages (DIN A4). The essays will be printed in a single page and of double-spaced typing.
- 2.** The original texts must be unpublished and must be written in Catalan, Spanish or English language. Five copies of the essay must be submitted to:

- 3.** The deadline for submission will be on 29th April 2011, at 2:00 pm.
- 4.** The original texts will have a pseudonym, and must be submitted together with a closed letter enclosing the author's full name and address.
- 5.** The members of the jury will be appointed by the Universitat de València and will include Vicent Alonso, Celia Amorós, Ramon Lapiedra, Xavier Rubert de Ventós and Tobies Grimaltos (as delegate of the Chancellor of the University of Valencia).
- 6.** The prize could be not awarded if the members of the jury consider that none of the essays submitted has the required quality.
- 7.** The prize is worth 10.000€ for just one essay. This amount of money corresponds to the royalties earned for its first edition (Catalan, Spanish, and/or English). The prize includes the publication of the essay in Catalan language by Publicacions de la Universitat de València.
- 8.** Publicacions de la Universitat de València will have the first option to acquire the rights to publish the essays submitted but not awarded. This option will expire after six months of being given the verdict by the jury.
- 9.** The decision of the jury will be announced on 14th June 2011, and there will be no right of appeal against the verdict. In the same way, the jury is entitled to solve all the questions of their competence that are not explicitly specified in these rules.
- 10.** The authors of the non-awarded essays can reclaim their original texts in the next three months after the awarding. The essays will be destroyed after this time.
- 11.** The submission of any essay to this prize involves the author's consent to these rules.
