The ideal candidate will have some digital experience of working on materials for social media, online campaigns and commissioning, writing and uploading content. A proven experience and interest of Literature, particularly contemporary UK writing is a must, as is some experience working on projects with digital communications & social media through professional experiences or other means.

Requirements

Applications close for our 2017 scheme on Sunday, 26 February at 23:59.

You must currently be a student, in at least your second year at University, and on target for a 2:1 degree (or equivalent), or you may also have graduated from your Bachelor's degree in 2016 achieving a 2:1 or above. You must hold at least a grade C or equivalent in Math's and English at GCSE. You must have the right to



work in the UK without restriction for the duration of the program. You must be available for the whole 10-week period without taking time for holiday. You must be available for a half day assessment center on either the 22 or 24 March 2017.
