

General Objective

The course will present some particular aspects of international migration that are not usually considered in the academic programs, since they are more practical and empirical. The course will rely on the over 3-decade long experience of the Scalabrinian Centers for Migration Studies in this specific field.

Specific Objectives

a) To present the development of the scientific research on international migration over the last thirty years, the most relevant literary production, the academic programs implemented in different regions, and the new hermeneutic challenges posed by modern migrations;

b) To consider some specific migration related issues from an interdisciplinary and global perspective, paying special attention to migrant second generations, contemporary migration politics, migration-religion nexus and multiculturalism.

c) To introduce some essential elements of migrants' cultures and idiosyncrasies, by means of practical workshops and study-tours.

d) To present some examples of on-going projects on prevention, protection and human promotion of migrants in different regions and to explain how to develop a project proposal.

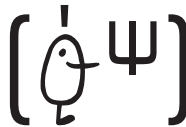
