Overview

Impact has become one of the key evaluation criteria in Pillar II (Industrial Leadership) and Pillar III (Societal Challenges) of Horizon 2020. Researchers have difficulty in understanding the concept of 'Impact' and in explaining the potential impact of their proposals.
