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1. PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The William Harvey International Translational Research Academy (WHRI-ACADEMY) is a new international mobility fellowship programme which aims to provide multidisciplinary projects to transnational researchers to help to maximize their career development opportunities in healthcare and life sciences. WHRI-ACADEMY is managed by the William Harvey Research Institute in Barts and The London School of Medicine and Dentistry, a faculty of Queen Mary University of London, United Kingdom. WHRI-ACADEMY receives funding from the European Union's Seventh Framework Programme for Research and Technological Development under Grant Agreement number 608765.

2. ORGANISATIONS AND THE PEOPLE INVOLVED

The research project shall be submitted by the Applicant in liaison with his/her chosen Host organisation. **Applicant** refers to the *Experienced Researcher* that applies for the mobility fellowship (*Incoming or Outgoing, see point 4*). **Host organisation** refers to the organization that administers the funding for the fellowship. The appointed *Experienced Researcher* carries out his/her research project in the chosen Host organisation. The section "Host organisations" gives information about the entities that have already agreed to take part in the WHRI-ACADEMY International Fellowship Programme (www.whri-academy.eu). Please note that WHRI-ACADEMY is open to enroll additional organisations. **Scientist-in-charge** refers to the person responsible for supervising and mentoring the appointed *Experienced Researcher* at the chosen Host organisation.

3. TOPIC OF THE PROJECT

Research fields within <u>healthcare</u> and <u>life sciences</u> are chosen freely by the applicants. All research carried out under WHRI-ACADEMY must adhere to fundamental ethical principles and meet the requirements set out in the text of the People Specific Programme:

Seven research areas are considered. The research areas are:

- 1) Molecular and Structural Biology and Biochemistry;
- 2) Physiology, Pathophysiology, including cardiovascular diseases and Endocrinology;
- 3) Genetics, Genomics, Bioinformatics and Systems Biology;
- 4) Cellular and Developmental Biology;
- 5) Neurosciences and Neural Disorders;
- 6) Immunity and Infection; and
- 7) Diagnostic Tools, Therapies and Public Health.

There is no predefined budget allocation among the research areas. The Applicant chooses the main research area of her/his project but secondary areas can also be selected in case of multidisciplinary projects.





4. TYPE OF MOBILITY FELLOWSHIPS AND DURATION

Under Call 4, WHRI-ACADEMY offers two types of transnational mobility fellowship. The final number of selected fellows will depend on the quality of the applications received.

In all cases (Incoming and Outgoing), the duration of the fellowship must be a *minimum of 12 months and a maximum of 32 months*.

5. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

A number of eligibility criteria must be fulfilled by the proposal submission deadline. Applications not meeting the criteria will not be evaluated but rejected instead.

For an application to be eligible:

- a) It must be received **before the deadline: 18 November 2015, <u>17h00 UK time</u>**
- b) It must be **submitted via email:** <u>x.sandin@qmul.ac.uk</u>
- c) It must **include the following 5 documents:**
 - Administrative Form
 - Research Project
 - Curriculum Vitae
 - Letter of Commitment
 - Budget
- d) Level of experience. Please note that applicants must, at the time of the recruitment by the chosen Host organisation, either be in possession of a doctoral degree (PhD), or have at least four years of research experience (full-time equivalent) since gaining a university diploma giving him/her access to doctoral studies either in the country in which the degree/diploma was obtained or in the country in which the research training is provided. Only time spent on post-graduate research activities (remunerated, and including the period of research training, e.g. PhD training) can be included (i.e. working outside research should not be taken into account).
- *e)* **Mobility rule.** Please note that applicants must not have resided or carried out their main activity in the chosen Host country for more than 12 months in the 3 years prior to the proposal submission deadline (*18 November 2015*).

Level of experience: restrictions

- First-professional degrees will not be considered in themselves as PhD-equivalent.
- Note that in the context of Marie Curie Actions, Medical Doctor (MD) studies are not taken as equivalent to PhD studies. For MDs, the requirement of 4 years of full-time research experience will apply.

6. FUNDING

The contribution of WHRI-ACADEMY is €37,250 per fellow-year.

Please note that the financial support for Marie Curie COFUND is calculated on the basis of eligible fellows-year and takes the form of grants covering up to 40% of the annual fellowship costs as specified in the Partnership Agreement between WHRI-ACADEMY and each of the institutions that have already enrolled as Host organisation within the Programme.

EXAMPLE

Chosen Host country: Belgium

Total EU contribution per fellow-year: €37,250.00

Please note that this EU contribution must not exceed 40% of the annual fellowship costs.

The annual budget (for 1 year project) shall therefore be €93,125.00

The contribution of the Principal Investigator to match the COFUND shall be 60% of the annual budget. That means €55,875.00.

The eligible expenses may be broadly divided into: a) Living allowance, b) Mobility allowance, and c) Contribution to the research costs.

Fellows receive a Living allowance. The Host organisations are allowed to use their own salary scales to support the costs for the fellows' salary costs. WHRI-ACADEMY contribution for the Living allowance is \notin 29,000 per fellow-year. If the Living Allowance is totally covered by a national/regional donor, the COFUND contribution for the Living Allowance cannot be used to top up the existing Living Allowance, unless approval of the national/regional donor. This contribution shall be moved to the "Contribution to the research costs".

The **Mobility allowance** is a relocation allowance and family status is not taken into consideration. WHRI-ACADEMY contribution for the Mobility allowance is \notin 750 per fellow-year.

The **Contribution to the research costs** will be provided for the benefit of the Fellow. WHRI-ACADEMY contribution for the "Contribution to the research costs" is €7,500 per fellow-year. The "Contribution to the research costs" will be managed by the Fellow with the support of the Scientist-in-Charge.





7. HOW TO APPLY

STEP 2: SELECT the research area of your interest

STEP 3: CHOSE the Host organisation and Scientist-in-Charge you wish to work with

STEP 4: CONTACT the chosen Scientist-in-Charge to discuss your project idea. Please note that it is important to prepare a project idea that fits well with the chosen laboratory research interests in order to convince him/her that you are the ideal candidate!

The section "Host organisations", <u>www.whri-academy.eu</u>, gives information about the institutions that have already agreed to take part in the Programme.

Please note that WHRI-ACADEMY is open to enroll additional Host organisations.

STEP 5: EXPRESSION OF INTEREST (EOI) – if the chosen Scientist-in-Charge approves your project idea and s/he is happy to accept you as a candidate for a WHRI-ACADEMY fellowship, you shall complete the EOI and send it to <u>x.sandin@qmul.ac.uk</u>

Please note that the template "Expression of Interest – EOI" can be found in the section "Application package", <u>www.whri-academy.eu</u>

STEP 6: PREPARE YOUR PROPOSAL jointly with your chosen Scientist-in-Charge and his/her organisation. Please note that the application documents can be found in the section "Application package", www.whri-academy.eu

STEP 7: SUBMIT your proposal via email, <u>x.sandin@qmul.ac.uk</u>, **before the deadline** (*18 November* 2015).

8. EVALUATION AND SELECTION

The evaluation and selection will take place within a maximum period of four months following the submission deadline. Each criterion will be scored out of 5, being 1 the lowest score and 5 the highest score. Weighting is equal among criteria and you need to reach a minimum score of 3 for each criterion.

9. INDICATIVE TIMETABLE

- Launch of the 4th Call for Proposals: 19 August 2015
- Deadline: 18 November 2015 at 17:00 (UK time)
- <u>Notification of the results</u>: up to 3.5 months after the deadline submission (no earlier than 28 Feb. 2016)
- <u>Notification of acceptance by successful applicants and negotiation of the fellowship contract</u>: within 14 days of receiving the notification of the results and confirmation of selected proposal for funding
- <u>Starting date of the project for successful applicants</u>: within a time frame of 3 months (*) following the notification of the results and confirmation of selected proposal for funding. Please note that 15 April 2016 is considered as the earliest eligible starting date.

(*) Depending on the duration of your project, it shall be lower than 3 months in order to complete it before December 2018, end date of this international fellowship programme.
