Tara has also helped Sylvana's daughter, Irina, who was not sure she wanted to go to university. Now she hopes to get into a top university. Irina now feels more confident about everything. She has even taken up exercise for the first time in years.

E Mo Ahmed has coached children as young as five years old. 'It could be something as simple as learning multiplication tables —asking them how they're going to do it, how are they going to make it fun? Mo has also helped teenager Regina who was having problems making friends when she moved to a new school. They talked together about the things Regina really enjoyed doing. By joining the school basketball team Regina has made several new friends.
