A) Format and style requirements

1. The text of national reports and presentations should not exceed ten (10) pages of DIN A4 paper and should be written following the instructions and using the paragraph styles of the document template

2. The text should be submitted to the Organization by email to the following address

3. The text must be submitted before 30 June 2008.

4. It will not be possible for authors to proofread their texts, so we recommend you take the utmost care in the final revision of the definitive text of your national report or presentation before sending it to the Organizer.

5. The author of the national report or presentation authorises the Organizer of the Colloquium and the entities responsible for its publication the usage rights to the report, with particular reference to its reproduction, distribution and broadcast rights in any kind of format in registers, magazines, publications – whether periodical or not – as well as in subsequent adaptations, whether singly or together with other contributions from different authors. This authorisation covers versions in hard copy, electronic media or in the form of databases on optical disks, CD-ROMs or DVDs, whether in single-user or network mode, as well as access to them by telecommunications, to the extent appropriate to the usage requirements of the work. The author also relinquishes the right to any economic remuneration for granting the rights for his work to be used in any of the media specified above. The Organizer will adhere strictly to copyright law on moral rights, and undertake not to receive any income from their publication other than to cover the cost of publication and the costs of organising the Colloquium.

6. These are the texts that will be published, provided that they comply with the established requirements mentioned above, and in the form the Organizer decides: a) national reports requested by general speakers; b) presentations submitted by people registered to attend the Colloquium.

7. These are the texts that might be presented publicly during the Colloquium sessions within the time limits established by the Organizer: a) national reports requested by general speakers; b) presentations submitted by people registered to attend the Colloquium provided that they have been previously selected.

8. Presentations will be selected depending on: a) The country in which the researcher who has submitted it works, so that it offers a representative vision of the status of legal science relating to the issue, and with respect to the different laws at an international level; b) the level of excellence achieved by the presentation, whether due to its methodology, the way in which it complements the general report, or its innovative approach in terms of the status of legal science on the issue.
