### Programme Description

The Masters creates experts in labour market intervention via employment policies, and of addressing various labour market issues. It offers a multidisciplinary approach, from legal, sociological, economic and psychological perspectives. The principal



components are the legal framework of employment policy, the Valencian labour market, employment and regional socio-economic development, gender perspectives, labour mediation and employment programme management. It includes work experience in institutions, organisations and businesses active in the field of labour relations and employment policies. It also contains bridging and further training modules (Labour Relations, Negotiation Techniques, Labour Economics, and Social and Labour Policies) to offer specialised subjects in an appropriate and uniform way for students who have not previously studied this field. With an additional research module it allows access to the Doctoral programme in Social Sciences, Employment and Human Resources at the University of Valencia.

## Objectives

- To create professionals capable of analysing employment and labour market issues in their different dimensions and from a multidisciplinary perspective, with particular attention to the current Valencian labour market and to gender perspectives.
- To provide tools for analysis and revitalisation of local labour markets and for the implementation of socio-economic development strategies on a territorial level.
- To understand the legal dimension, and the institutional and regulatory policies of social development and employment in Spain, the European Union and the Valencian Region.
- To prepare students for management of programmes and current employment policies, and intervention in the labour market.

## Specific Admission Requirements

To access the Masters it is necessary to possess an official Spanish university degree, or one issued by a European Higher Education Area (EHEA) institution, whose degrees are authorised to allow entry to a Masters course. Also, graduates with unaccredited degrees from non-EHEA-adapted institutions may be admitted, following confirmation by the University that they provide a level of training equivalent to that of a Spanish university degree and would allow access to post graduate studies in that country. Access by this route does not denote official validation of the degree, however, nor its acceptance for any other purposes than entry to the Masters programme.

## Selection Criteria

Admission to the Masters will be assessed from the merit points of candidates. The scale of assessment of merit is as follows (maximum 10 points):



a) Academic record (maximum 7 points)

Diploma in labour relations, degree in social science, labour science, labour relations and human resources, sociology, diploma in social work: average grade multiplied by 1

Degree in law, economics, business administration, political science and public administration, diploma in business management and administration: average grade multiplied by 0.8

Degrees and diplomas in other area of legal and social sciences and the humanities: average grade multiplied by 0.5

Other degrees and diplomas: average grade multiplied by 0.3

b) Proven professional experience in the field of employment management and intervention in the labour market (maximum 2 points)

c) Other merits related to the objectives of the Masters (maximum 1 point)
