Job description

You will be working in the research group of Professor Wilmar Schaufeli, who occupies the Chair of Work & Organisational Psychology in the sub-department of Social & Organisational Psychology. The sub-department employs some 35 academic staff and, together with the sub-departments of Clinical & Health Psychology, Developmental Psychology, and Experimental Psychology, offers BA and MA programmes for approximately 3000 students. The sub-department of Social & Organisational Psychology runs one-year MA programmes in Social Psychology, Work & Organisational Psychology and Occupational Health Psychology, and participates in the two-year MSc programme in Psychological Health Research.

You will conduct research within the programme of Work, Stress and Health, which is embedded in the Utrecht-based Linschoten Research Institute for Psychology and the national Research Institute for Psychology & Health (see http://pandh.fss.uu.nl). The research programme is particularly strong in the areas of occupational burnout and work engagement. In the latest research assessment exercise, the programme was rated overall as excellent (quality: 5; productivity: 4; relevance: 4; viability: 4). Utrecht University is consistently ranked in the Top 10 of European research universities in the Shanghai Rankings (see http://ed.sjtu.edu.cn/ranking.htm).

You will be expected to:

- teach in Work and Organisational Psychology at BA and MA levels, and provide supervision of BA and MA research projects, theses and placements.
- conduct research in the area of Occupational Health Psychology.

Qualifications

- PhD, preferably in (Work and Organisational) Psychology, or any other relevant social science.
- Broad knowledge of the field of Work and Organisational Psychology.
- Excellent track record in Occupational Health Psychology Research.
- Demonstrable teaching skills.
- Ability to raise grant funding.
- Meets the membership criteria of the Research Institute (see http://pandh.fss.uu.nl).
- A good command of Dutch and English, both spoken and written. If you do not speak Dutch, you should be willing to learn the language (the Faculty is offering a free Dutch-language course).

Terms of employment

This is a permanent position, dependent on performance during an initial two-year probationary period. The appointment, under the collective labour agreement of the Dutch Universities, will be made on salary scale 11/12 and will be in the range of \notin 3,024.- to \notin 4,705.- gross per month for a

full-time appointment, depending on qualifications and experience. The University offers excellent fringe benefits, such as a contribution to childcare costs and 43 paid days off per annum for a 40-hour working week. In addition, you are entitled to holiday pay of 8% per annum. You will be expected to learn Dutch in the first year of your appointment.
