Dear friends and colleagues,

The emergence of new applications and technologies opens a wide range of possibilities regarding new forms of communication in the scientific world. Aware of this we are glad to present the **Ist Palaeontological Virtual Congress** with the purpose of spreading worldwide the most recent scientific advances in palaeontology in a fast, easy and economical way.

This congress is pioneer in palaeontology, being exclusively developed in a virtual environment. Oral communications and posters about any palaeontological field will be presented through an online platform created ad hoc.

The simplicity of this new format allows for low-cost registration fees and saving travel and maintenance expenses. Consequently, this initiative aims to give international projection to the palaeontological research carried out by groups with limited economic resources and promoting the participation of palaeontologists from developing countries.

Moreover, the 1st Palaeontological Virtual Congress combines the benefits of traditional meetings (i.e., providing a forum for discussion, including guest lectures or the production of an abstract book among other things) with the advantages of online platforms, which allow reaching a higher number of researchers around the world.

- Deadline for abstract submission: 20th September
- Deadline for regular registration: 16th November

Consequently, any place with good WiFi signal is enough to participate.

As in a tradicional congress, participants who wish to present a communication must send an abstract in advance.



GUIDELINES FOR ABSTRACTS AND COMMUNICATIONS

Researchers are invited to provide a brief abstract from now until 20th September 2018. Abstract body is limited to 250 words. No references, images, or tables should be included in the abstract.

The abstract must be uploaded as DOC or DOCX file to palaeovc@uv.es, specifying: PALAEOVC 2018 abstract First Author's surname

The authors will have three possibilities for presenting their works/:

Slides Presentations / Posters / Video Presentations.

Slides, posters and videos will be displayed directly in the website during the whole timespan of the congress (between December 1st and 15th). The platform will be accesible 24 hours a day during this time.

Participants will be able to ask questions and make comments about them in different discussion chats.

The platform used for Presentation Slides, Posters and Videos will be Slideshare.

SLIDESHARE: How it works?

Any participant that would like to present a communication must have an account in Slideshare/Linkedin.

Next, the authors must upload the Slides/Poster/Video presentation to their profile.

- The maximum number of slides in the presentation is 30.
- Posters should be submitted in PDF format.
- Videos must be in mp4 format. More information about it will be available soon.

Once the slides/poster/video presentation is uploaded, the authors have to send the URL/link or code of the communication to the Organising Committee or to the workshop manager in which the communication will be presented.

The Organisation will upload it to the congress web, so it can be accessed by registered guests only.

WORKSHOPS

The 1st Palaeontological Virtual Congress will be organized in a number of general theme sessions trying to span the whole variety of potential contributions. However, palaeontology is a wide discipline which encompasses a huge variety of topics. Aware of this and taking advantage of the flexibility that virtual platforms offer, workshop proposals on emerging topics, innovative techniques or any other matter that you consider of interest are welcome to be addressed in depth during the celebration of the congress. The purpose of such workshops is to provide a comprehensive forum for the exchange of ideas and discuss the issue within specialists in the target field.

If you are interested in proposing a specific workshop, please send us a brief description (no more than 300 words) with the main goals and any relevant information that you may consider relevant. Please, indicate in the proposal the full name of the organisers and their respective affiliations.

Proposals should be submitted by email to palaeovc@uv.es before August 7th. Notification of acceptance will be sent to the organizers after that. If your workshop is accepted, the proposed organizers will be in charge of moderating the sessions (discussion chats) and look for contributions (ideally a single workshop would require the participation of at least 10 contributions).

ABOUT THE LOGO

The 1st Palaeontological Virtual Congress logo, made by Hugo Salais (biologist and palaeoillustrator), represents the panarthropod *Anomalocaris* (Cambrian period) surrounded by a globe which shows the position of the landmasses of its time. Because this is a general palaeontological themed congress, we have chosen this animal because it represents the essence of the enigmas that surround life in the distant past. In this sense, *Anomalocaris* is the perfect choice, an almost alien-like organism that lived on a distant past and was the result of one of the major biological diversity explosions in the history of Earth.
