With the invention of printing in the 1450ies, Johannes Gutenberg from Mainz changed the world. In the seminar we will have a close look at the life, the personal network and the historical circumstances under which Johannes Gutenberg developed his invention. A special focus is given to Italy where with the help of German printers and the special interest of the papacy, the clergy and the universities the new invention spread very quickly.

As to Familia Borja, the sessions will address the most well-known members of the family from various perspectives: their origins in Iberia, their arrival to the papacy, their political projection in and outside Italy, their artistic patronage, and the creation and reception of the 'Black Legend' that has led them to be shown as representative of the corruption of the Holy See in novels and TV shows.
