The Journal *Applied Psychology: An international Review* Topic is opening a call for the special issue on the topic of **Inclusion of people with limitations in organizational contexts**.

The aim of this special issue is to bring together research concerning the inclusion and participation of people with functional limitations in organisational settings, including research that compares best practices in various countries, industrial sectors, organisational types, and forms of employment. We welcome systematic reviews, conceptual and empirical contributions employing qualitative or quantitative methods.

Abstracts (between 250 –300 words) detailing the aims of the paper, main findings and implications should be submitted **by March 1st, 2021**, via the Submission portal of Applied Psychology: An International Review. Authors will receive feedback on their abstract by June 2021. The deadline for full papers is December 1st, 2021.

Profesor Vicente Martínez-Tur ha participado en un webinar sobre la contribución de las organizaciones del Tercer Sector a un mundo mejor.

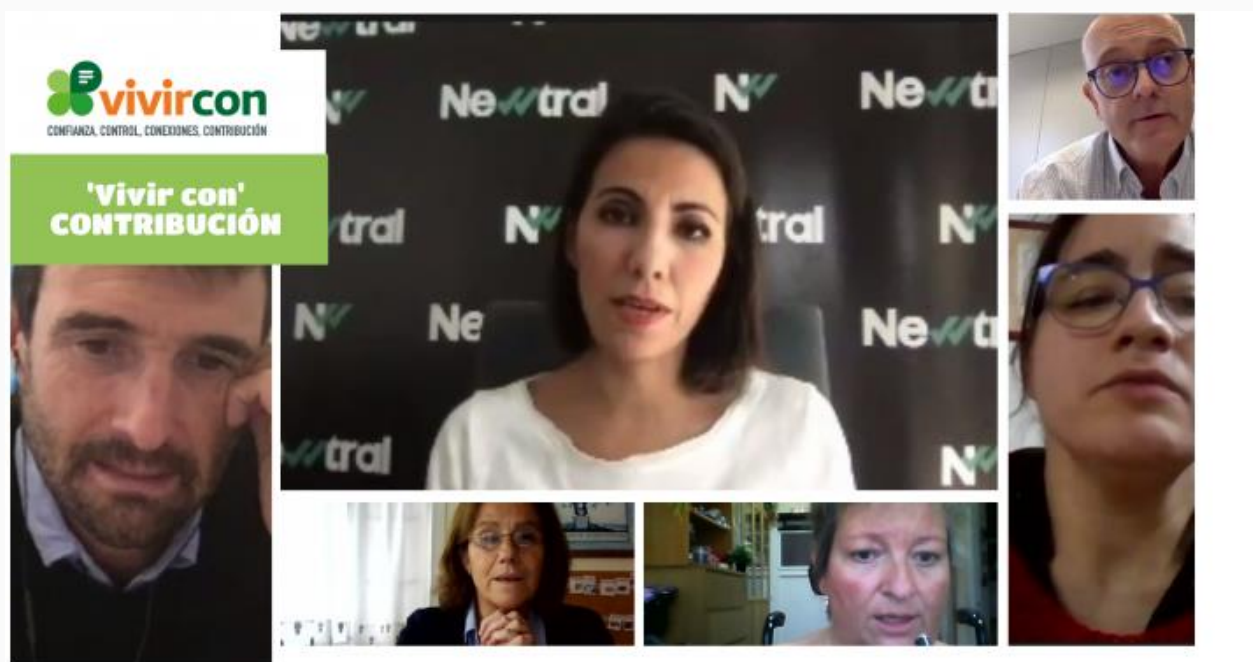
