NEWS Interview with José María Peiró: Continuous Training and the Humanizing Role of Organizational Psychology

On May 27, the COPC recognized 21 psychologists with the EuroPsy certification in Work and Organizational Psychology. As a guest, José María Peiró emphasized that current social, technological, and psychological changes require continuous training. EuroPsy demands five years of academic training, one year of supervised practice, and regular renewal. Peiró called for better regulation of master's programs in Spain to balance specialties and ensure quality. He stressed the importance of well-trained supervisors who can guide and correct from the very beginning. He argued that organizational psychology can humanize work and address global challenges. He also advocated for a concept of happiness that combines pleasure, meaning, relationships, and personal growth. He concluded by encouraging psychologists to be honest, demanding, curious, and innovative.

On June 3rd, former EM WOP-P Master students Claudia Pergola and Pablo Francisco Tomé delivered an online masterclass to current students of the program. Both are now Talent Acquisition Specialists at Amaris Consulting.

A half-century perspective of entrepreneur's well-being: comparing academic and global entrepreneurship monitor trends

SUMMARY

A recent article published in Humanities and Social Sciences Communications (Q1) analyzes 50 years of research on entrepreneurs' well-being, and the findings are thoughtprovoking. Through a bibliometric analysis of 961 articles, the study reveals a concerning mismatch: more than 80% of entrepreneurs live in developing economies, yet most of the research on their well-being originates from developed countries.
