Introduction

This is a general guide for Exchange students that plan to follow some studies at the Chemistry Faculty. In this guide, we have pointed out some aspects of the student's life in the Campus de Burjassot but also the contents map of the degree in Chemistry.

Location of the Chemistry Faculty

Valencia University's faculties and schools are to be found in three campuses spread through Valencia and Burjassot:

- In the Campus de Tarongers you can find the Faculties/Schools of Economy, Social Sciences and Law.
- In the Campus de Blasco Ibañez, located in the Avenida de Blasco Ibañez, you can find all the centres in the area of Humanities/Arts, as well as the Faculty /School of Medicine and Orthodontics, Psychology and the College of Nursing. In this area you will also find the International Relations Office.
- The Campus de Burjassot-Paterna is the location of the Chemistry Faculty and others Faculties/Schools of Sciences like Mathematics, Pharmacy, Physics, Biology and, the recently created School of Engineering that integrates five different technical degrees like for example Chemical Engineering (a five years degree).

Facilities

General campus services comprise a library, two cafeterias and two dining rooms, a copy centre located at the Secretary building and a bank office (Banco Santander Central Hispano). There is also a small gymnasium and several sport facilities are located in the vicinity (two swimming pools, outdoor athletics tracks, etc.).

Catering service

The Campus of Burjassot has two restaurants that offer meals at economical prices for students: one located in the Pharmacia Faculty and other placed in between the buildings B and C (see campus map). The price of a three-course set menu is between 3 and 4 euro, which includes 1st and 2nd course, dessert and a drink. Otherwise, you can choose a "bocadillo" (filled roll) at prices around 1,5 and 2,5 euro.

Microwave ovens are available to students who prefer to bring their own food.

Libraries

There is a library on each campus, which can be used by all students at the University. Books can be taken out on loan for 3 days; students must show their student card. Here are some of the libraries you should visit:

Transport services from Valencia to Burjassot

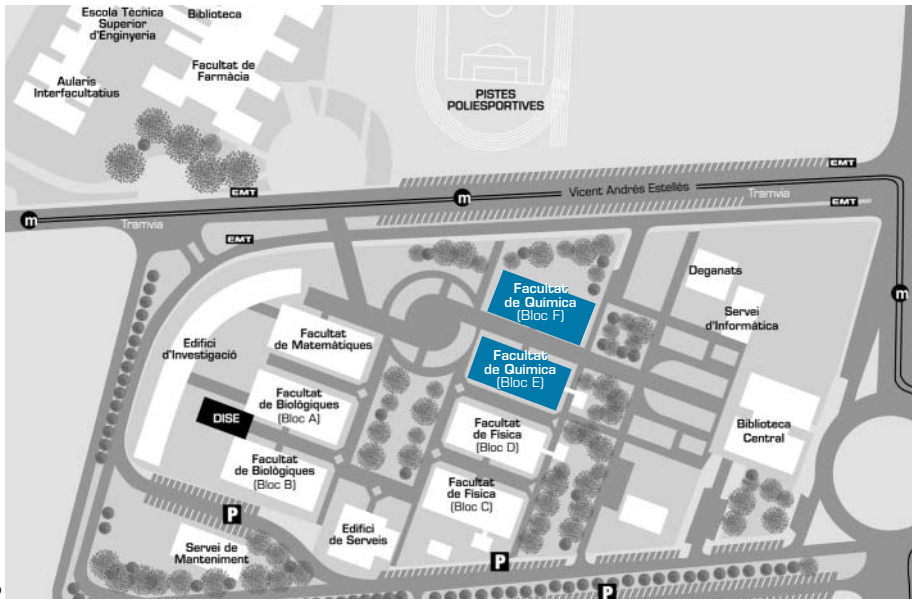
Burjassot is only 5 km far from the centre of Valencia. In the present time there is almost no discontinuity between the two towns. There is an extensive transport network of busses, underground and tramway leading to the campus of Burjassot:

Tramway:

Company "FGV" line 4 (blue) stopping down in "Campus de Burjassot" and "Vicent Andres Estelles" stops.

Underground:

the underground does not have a stop on the campus, but you can get line 1 (yellow) and get off at the "Empalme" stop, changing here to catch the tramway line 4 (free of charge), which takes you right to the Campus.

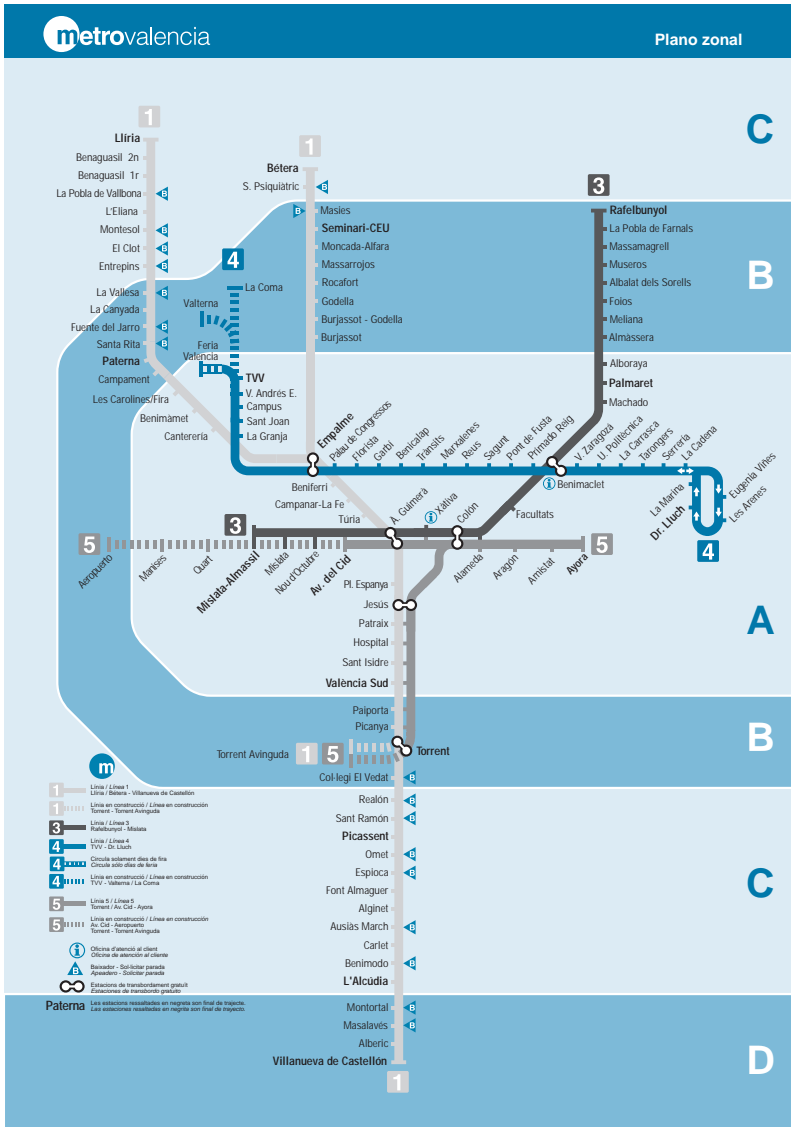


Bus:

EMT (red busses from the municipality). The line arriving to the campus is number 63, only during weekday and lective periods (last stop) .

Prices

Travelling by bus is the cheapest if you buy a “bono-bus” (bus pass). A single ticket is around 0,9 €, whereas if you buy a 10-ticket pass it is only 0.5 €. There are several possibilities of bus passes that let you to save money.

Organization

The Chemistry of Faculty only has one degree: Chemistry (Licenciatura de Química)

The Chemistry Faculty is organized in four departments, namely: Analytical, Inorganic, Organic, and Physical Department. All of them are located, mainly in the two buildings (E and F, see campus map) but also in other buildings as the Centro Jeroni Muñoz and the Faculty of Pharmacy. Two Research Institutes: *Instituto de Ciencia de los Materiales* (Materials Science Institute <http://www.uv.es/icmuv/>) and *Instituto de Ciencia Molecular* (Molecular Research Institute, <http://www.uv.es/icmol/>) concentrates several very active research groups in chemistry.

Lecture rooms are distributed in the two main buildings (E and F) but also in the Aulario Interfacultativo (see campus map). All the laboratories are located in the buildings (E and F). They are recently renovated offering very good conditions to perform the practical works.

Several computer rooms available for the students are located at the building F. All the Erasmus students can use them in the same conditions that the rest of the students. For example you can get an e-mail address and check you mail using this computers. You can also use them to prepare your practical works, etc.

How to get Burjassot

AIR: Manises Airport – Valencia

If you come by plane, there is a bus service that leaves you at the Central Bus Station and from there you can get the bus line (EMT) or underground. If you are coming to the campus straight from the airport, the easiest and quickest way is to get a taxi, which will take you approximately five minutes, as the Burjassot campus is near the airport. It can cost around 6-8 €.

TRAIN: Estacion del Norte – Valencia (RENFE)

If you come by train, you must get off at the Estacion del Norte (the Central Rail Station), which is in the city centre. Just as you come out of the station into the calle Bailén, you can get the bus line 63, which goes right to the Burjassot Campus. You are also very near the underground station (called Xàtiva or Játiva).

UNDERGROUND

The underground does not have a stop on the Campus. You can get Line 1 (yellow line) and get off the Empalme stop, changing here to catch the tramway, line 4 (blue line), which takes you right to the Campus. Other possibility is to get off the Cantereria stop only 10 minutes walking from the Campus. Both the underground and the busses run from six in the morning to around ten at night. After this time only a few night busses run until one thirty in the morning (or until three in the morning on Thursday, Friday and Saturday) (<http://www.metrovalencia.com>). The tramway line 4 links the Campus de Burjassot with the Campus de Tarongers and also the Universidad Politécnica de Valencia (<http://www.upv.es>).



BUSSES

There are numerous municipal bus lines (EMT) that you can catch to get to Burjassot campus. One that goes right to the campus is the 63 bus, which can be caught near the train (RENFE: Estación del Norte) station, however, this only runs on week days. The line 62 reaches Benimamet, a neighbourhood next to Burjassot, and from which you can walk to the campus in 15 minutes. At night the N3 night bus leaves from the Plaza del Ayuntamiento and stops at the Campus. (<http://www.emtvalencia.es>).

BY CAR/PRIVATE VEHICLE

If you are entering Valencia by car you can take the bypass (ring road, see map) whatever direction you are coming from (Madrid, Barcelona or Alicante) as this is the quickest route to the C-234 which takes you to Burjassot Campus. The International Trade Fair (Fira de Mostres) is next to Burjassot Campus and is well sign-posted, bordering Paterna; it is a good reference point.

From Valencia

If you are coming to Burjassot from Valencia, you should take the C-234, called also Pista de Ademuz, which takes you straight to the Campus. Both the Valencia Television Centre (TVV; Canal 9) and the International Trade Fair are good reference points, although the Campus itself is perfectly visible from the road.

From Valencia by bike

Biking is easy in Valencia because it is completely flat. There are no special pathways for biking but you can use the tramway line, that is a secure way.



Procedure to follow for admission to the University of Valencia

Information for the Coordinators

- 1 Every academic year and before the course finishes, the I.R.O. (International Relations Office), send as many applications forms as agreed exchange students, to those Universities with which a bilateral agreement has been signed. The Universities have to return these applications, completed according to the given instructions and with the period stipulated on the application form.
- 2 Once the application forms containing the students' data have been received, the I.R.O. sends them to the Coordinators at each centre. Those Universities that have their own application forms where admission by the coordinator of the centre of destination is specifically required, can send the application form straight to the centre coordinator so that it is signed and returned, but they must also send the University of Valencia application form.



Information for the students

- 1 Students can consult the information concerning the syllabus and the subjects at the following web site: <http://centros.uv.es/web/centros/quimica/castellano/> and they can also speak to the degree coordinator to solve possible doubts.
- 2 The students can follow any subjects of the Chemistry degree. Given that the University of Valencia registers students only once a year at the beginning of the course, it is important that the foreign students arrive before the academic course starts (in the third week of September) in case they have to take annual subjects or subjects belonging to the first term, so that they can reserve a place in their chosen subjects. In the case of staying from the second term only, the students should tell the degree coordinator the subjects they would like to study, for the same reason.
- 3 If the incoming student would like to carry out a research project such as DEA (France), Tesi di Laurea (Italy), Diplomarbeit (Germany), etc., he/she has to inform the Erasmus degree coordinator in advance (at least two months before the arrival) and send a CV and an authorization of the person in charge of him/her at the university of origin. He/she has to specificate the field in which he/she would like to work and justify the reasons for doing it in the University of Valencia as well. The coordinator will evaluate the application and, if accepted, will notify the student how to proceed.
- 4 On arrival, the foreign students should go first to the I.R.O. in order to enrol and to get the student card. Next, they should contact with the degree coordinator that will take care of the administrative process to inscribe him in the pertinent courses.
- 5 After finishing their stay, the Faculty will issue a certificate which will reflect the qualifications obtained in the subjects taken, signed by the degree coordinator. On student request, teachers can issue partial certificates in which the successfully passed subjects contents will be explained.

- 6 The University of Valencia cannot take on the responsibility of student accommodation, therefore students should enquire at the institutions or addresses list after this, in order to find accommodation.

Syllabus

The Chemistry Faculty follows a five-year syllabus, which comprises two cycles (3 + 2 years). The different subjects are structured around a system of credits (following the old ECTS system). Each credit is equivalent to 10 hours of lectures of practical/demonstration classes (a Spanish credit is equivalent to one ECTS).

It is important to know that the subject matters can:

- Run for a year annual or six months (semester), although the lectures and practical lessons run only during two quarters.
- Be theory or practical. In some few subjects there are practical demonstrations linked to the theoretical lectures, so if one wishes to follow the practical part of the subject one must also attend the corresponding lectures. But in general practical subjects are independent modules you can choose without further restrictions.
- **Core and compulsory subjects:** are the subjects that are compulsory for the Spanish chemistry students to follow in order to obtain their Degree.
- **Optional:** there is a wide range of subjects from which the students can choose, depending on the specialisation that interest those most.

- **Free option or choice:** refers to a limited number of subjects offered by the other faculties belonging to the Valencia University that chemistry students can follow even though they are not thematically linked to their degree course.

Academic calendar

The calendar can undergo small variations depending on the academic year. You can consult the details for each course in the http://www.uv.es/~webuv/estudis/calendari_academic.htm

In general the calendar is as follows:

- 1 The first quarter begins at the last week of September and finishes at the end of January. This period is followed by a period of exams, lasting 2 or 3 weeks.
- 2 The second quarter begins the second week of February and finishes at the beginning of June. The exam corresponding to this quarter takes place mid June.

In July and September, from the 1st to the 15th approximately, there two periods for exams for those students who did not pass in the first sitting.

Lectures

Attendance is not compulsory, although it is advisable to take most of the lecturer's explanations. However, it is compulsory to attend the practical or demonstration classes.

Normally each lecturer has specific times for tutorials, during which you can speak to them to clarify any doubts you have about the subject. These times are displayed on the notice boards in the corresponding Department or on the door of the lecturer's office.

There are two exams (also called "convocatorias") during the academic course for each subject. The second is for those who did not sit the first exam or who failed it. Some lecturers offer the opportunity to do partial exams throughout the academic course, which, depending on the subject, can mean the exclusion of certain subject matter from the final exam.

The student has the right for the exam to be revised, in order to check the correction and the mark. The lecturer who sits the exam establishes the day, time and place of a revision of this type. Sometimes the lecturer thinks it necessary to include projects, seminars or talks by the students in the final mark.

Finally, for regular course subjects, tuition language is Spanish.

The Matrícula de Honor is given hardly in Spain. A maximum of 5% of the students per course can get this mark.

In Burjassot there are other private residences for students that offer the possibility of lodging during periods from a week to several months. They are not very expensive.

Sharing a flat

If you decide you would rather rent a house or shared flat, you can find numerous adverts on the notice boards in and around the schools, as well as in the CADE or DISE offices or adverts in shops and streets near the Campus. This is the option most frequently chosen by students in general, and is, above all, the most economical option. Prices start with 180 €. a month including common expenses (water, electricity and community charges), in ha furnished flat. However, prices depend on the area, the number of students sharing the flat, and of course the use of electricity, water, gas and telephone.

Whatever the choice, students should bear in mind that it is not a good idea to arrive in the city at the last minute unless they have previously booked lodgings, because depending on the time of arrival it will be more or less difficult to find the right kind of place. It is important to understand that the University of Valencia is not responsible for providing foreign students with board and lodgings, even though they will give advice and help on how to look for it.

To summarize, the best ways to find lodging are:

- Look at the adverts on the faculty notice boards and those listed by the CADE.
- Look at adverts in weekly newspapers (Trajín, Baúl, etc.) which advertise flats to let and share.
- Through a state agent. These require a fee and deposit which equal one or two months rent. The deposit is returned at the end of the contract if here are no damages to the property and all expenses have been paid. You should demand a signed contract that outlines all the norms and obligations that each party must fulfil.
- Ask around. Fellow students may free rooms in their flats, adverts can also be found in student areas.
- Some landlords/ladies offer rooms to lodgers in their own homes, sharing their house with them.
