Since 2002, I am Assistant Professor in the Economics Department at Universitat Jaume I de Castelló and researcher in the Instituto de Economía Internacional (Institute for International Economics). Since 2018 I hold the position of vice-rector for Internacionalisation and Cooperation at the University.

My main interest research is in the field of international economics, focusing on the study of intra-industry trade and the impact of international migration flows on trade and FDI. My research has been published in Applied Economics, Economic Modeling, European Journal of Population, Regional Studies and Welwirtschaftliches Archiv/Review of World Economics European Journal of Population, Regional Studies.
