1. Scientific Contribution:

Javier Ordóñez (JO) has more than 50 publications in international journals, along with 3 book chapters in MIT University Press, Routledge, and Palgrave Macmillan. He has presented at more than 120 international conferences, been a member of the scientific committee for over 23, and organized 19. He has served as the principal investigator in 14 projects and participated in a total of 45. His research has accumulated 580 citations in Web of Science, 654 in Scopus, and 1,455 in Google Scholar. H-index is 15. According to Scopus, 32.3% of his published research is among the top 25% most cited documents worldwide, while 56.7% is published in the top 25% journals ranked by CiteScore. His main line of research is convergence in the EU. This and subsequent works have analyzed the negative

effects of poor economic governance design on real convergence, extending the analysis in various studies to socioeconomic indicators such as unemployment, inequality, or social exclusion.

2. Contribution to Society:

JO has delivered more than 12 lectures for the general public, primarily related to the European economic integration process and recent crises, in both national and international institutions. He has written outreach articles for local press, *Investigación y Ciencia* magazine, and *El Mundo* newspaper. He has participated in some programs on local television and radio in Spain and Mexico, where he also carried out and led a research team at the Economic Research and Intelligence Center on inequality and poverty. JO has been Deputy-head of the Castellón City Chair, which, with an annual budget of €75,000, organized outreach and research dissemination activities and collaborates with prestigious institutions such as the Rei Jaume I Awards Foundation. JO has conducted research for the Valencian Institute of Economic Research and the Institute of Fiscal Studies. In 2009, he led an initiative for the economic restructuring of the Algerian economy as part of a program sponsored by the Spanish Agency for International Cooperation.

3. Other Contributions:

JO has supervised 5 doctoral theses and is currently supervising 2 more. Two of his doctoral students received research personnel training grants to complete their theses. Additionally, he has overseen more than 30 master's theses, most of them at foreign universities. He has extensive experience teaching in doctoral programs and directed the Doctoral Program in Economics at Universitat Jaume I (UJI) from 2008 to 2011. JO has also conducted up to 8 workshops and training courses aimed at young researchers at foreign institutions, including the Korean Development Institute and the National Research Institute for Policy Studies. JO is a member of the Sapiencia Awards jury, which aims to foster scientific vocations by awarding research projects carried out by high school students. JO has led several research teams. In 2007, his team received a grant from the Valencian Government (GV) for emerging groups, later receiving funding for consolidated teams in 2016. Furthermore, from 2008 to 2013, he directed the Research Group on Economic Integration, which initially received funding from UJI as an excellence group and later from the GV under the Prometeo program. From 2016 to 2021, JO served as the director of the Inter-University Institute of International Economics. During his tenure, he promoted the institute's research activities, leading to a collaboration agreement with the Energy Research Accelerator Consortium of the United Kingdom, as well as partnerships with other organizations such as the Spanish Association of International Economics and Finance, which he also chaired from 2017 to 2020. JO is a founding partner of Intelligence, Risk and Monitoring Analytics, S.A., a startup that provides artificial intelligence solutions for economic analysis. JO has been an editor of *Economic Modelling*, *The Energy Journal*, *The World Economy*, *The Global Finance Journal*, and the *Journal of Applied Economics* among others. He is also an expert reviewer for the Spanish State Research Agency.
