

COMPULSORY ADDITIONAL REQUIREMENTS FOR FOREIGN UNIVERSITY DEGREES

The documentation required in the previous paragraph 2 shall fulfill the following 3 **REQUIREMENTS**:

1. OFFICIAL	All documents must have been issued by the competent authorities of the country.		
2. LEGALIZED	Documents issued in Member States of the European Union or signatories to the Agreement on the European Economic Area.	Is not required any kind of legalization	Countries: Austria, Belgium, Bulgaria, Cyprus, Denmark, Slovakia, Slovenia, Estonia, Finland, France, Greece, Holland, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Liechtenstein, Luxembourg, Malta, Norway, Poland, Czech Republic, Romania and Sweden. Also Switzerland.
	Documents issued in countries subscribers of the Hague Convention of October 5, 1961. 	Documents issued in other countries .	<p>They must be legalized through diplomatic channels. To that purpose, the documents must be submitted in the following agencies:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Ministry of Education in the country of origin for certificates of studies, and in the corresponding Ministry for birth certificates.- Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the country where such documents were issued.- Diplomatic or consular representation of Spain in that country. <p>The documents issued by diplomatic or consular authorities of other countries should be legalized in Spain in the Spanish Ministry of Foreign Affairs.</p>
3. TRANSLATED	<p>Through any of the following ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Translator jury, properly licensed or registered in Spain.- Diplomatic or consular representation of Spain abroad.- Diplomatic or consular representation in Spain of the country where the applicant is a citizen or, if appropriate, where the document comes from.
