The Sociology course is a core subject in the Social Education degree program. The course content is structured around two key elements: on the one hand, the fundamental conceptual and theoretical knowledge necessary for training professionals in the social field; and on the other, the learning and application of a sociological perspective for analyzing reality. The aim is to equip future professionals with a global, critical, and in-depth understanding of the world around them.

Furthermore, as a subject within the Social Education degree, it seeks to provide a qualified approach to social and educational phenomena through sociological analysis. For this reason, it covers the most relevant content for initiating an analysis of education as a social phenomenon, shaped by specific historical, political, social, cultural, and economic configurations.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY



This is a theoretical-practical subject, aimed at providing conceptual and methodological tools for analyzing society. Additionally, it is an introductory course targeted at students unfamiliar with the subject. Both aspects require starting from the teacher's explanation of the topics. However, the subject also demands personalized work from students who, guided by the teacher's directions, analyze and reflect on the proposed materials to achieve a genuine understanding of the suggested concepts.

Finally, given the reflective nature of sociology and anthropology regarding reality, it is considered appropriate to carry out activities that allow students to contrast theoretical knowledge with social and educational realities.

The approaches outlined lead us to structure the course methodology so that it is not confined to classroom activities but requires personal and group effort, always under the teacher's guidance and supervision. This involves employing diverse methodologies: theoretical explanation, analysis and commentary of texts and current news, empirical research, and directed study.

EVALUATION

To ensure the acquisition and development of the competencies (conceptual, procedural, and attitudinal) associated with the subject, evaluation will be carried out through various procedures, taking into account the activities completed by the students.

The subject will be divided into two blocks, one theoretical and one practical. The written exam will account for 50% of the final grade, and practical exercises and assignments will account for the other 50%.

The evaluation of the practical block will be based on practical activities and assignments (individual and/or group) specified by the professor in charge of the subject and according to established deadlines.

The evaluation of the theoretical block will be conducted through an individual written development exercise (which may combine long-answer questions with shorter ones) and will be based on the program contents, class development, and materials used.

This exercise will be carried out according to the official call established by the Faculty.

Specification of procedures and criteria: The teaching staff in charge of the subject will specify at the beginning of the course the types of practicals and assignments to be completed, indicating which exercises are recoverable or not, the evaluation method for each, and the criteria to pass each block of the subject as well as the proportion of its weight in the overall evaluation (within the specified percentage).

Fraudulent conduct in assessment tests and plagiarism in assessment work will be considered in accordance with the UV Assessment and Grading Regulations (ACGUV 108/2017) and the Protocol for Action against Fraudulent Practices (ACGUV 123/2020).

The use of technologies (including AI) to create assessment materials without prior and express



authorization from the teaching staff will prevent them from being considered as self-authored and will be treated according to current regulations and the UV Code of Coexistence and Good Practices (ACGUV 300/2023, DOGV, no. 9747/18.12.2023).
