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SUMMARY

This course delves into the art produced in the Valencian Region from the late 15th century to the present day, aiming to highlight the value of local heritage and promote new research on what is most immediate and familiar. It offers a global perspective on the artistic phenomenon, relating each Valencian expression to developments in the rest of Spain and Europe.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

a) Three hours per week of classroom sessions

These will consist of theoretical and practical sessions using visual resources, during which the essential aspects of the subject will be presented and the relevant bibliography systematized. To make effective use of these sessions, students will be encouraged to read the assigned materials, textbooks, or selected texts in advance. These readings may be subject to evaluation. The practical component will be integrated into the in-person sessions, including activities such as commentary and analysis of texts or images related to the course content.

b) Attendance at seminars, guided tours, or other activities

Mandatory attendance may be required for certain activities organized by the teaching staff, such as seminars, guided tours, or similar academic events.

c) Attendance at office hours and scheduled tutorials

Students may attend scheduled office hours to consult on any aspect related to the course. Additionally, programmed tutorials may be arranged when deemed appropriate.

EVALUATION

1. Final exam at the end of the semester, combining theoretical and practical components. A minimum grade of 4 out of 10 is required to pass. The same requirements apply for the second exam session.
2. Readings recommended by the teaching staff and/or complementary activities.
3. Assessment of individual practical assignments required throughout the course.

In summary:

Written exam: 50-60%

Bibliographic readings and/or complementary activities: 20-30%

Individual practical assignments: 10-30%

In the second exam session, only the final exam will be retaken. The grades obtained in the other components will be retained from the first session.
