The TFG may consist of a research project or it may have a more practical or professional aspect, dealing with the in-depth study of a specific practical case. In the latter case, it may be linked to the activities carried out in the external work placement subject, which is adapted to the subject offered by the Department to which the TFG tutor to which the student is assigned belongs.

RELATIONSHIP TO OTHER SUBJECTS OF THE SAME DEGREE

There are no specified enrollment restrictions with other subjects of the curriculum.

OTHER REQUIREMENTS

To submit the final degree project, it will be necessary to have passed all the subjects from the preceding courses of the study plan and to be enrolled in all the subjects of the last course, the passing of which would allow obtaining the Degree.

COMPETENCES / LEARNING OUTCOMES

Know and be able to analyse administrative and financial planning, management and assessment in public services, and be able to design strategies for organisational improvement and quality assurance.

Know and be able to analyse electoral processes, both from an institutional point of view and from the



point of view of the behaviour of collective and individual actors.

Know and be able to analyse the characteristics and guidelines for action of the main political actors (parties, trade unions, interest groups and new social movements).

Know and be able to analyse the design, planning, management and evaluation of public policies.

Know and be able to analyse the policies of equality between men and women, of equal opportunities and of non-discrimination, as well as the policies that promote solidarity, environmental protection and the culture of peace.

Know and be able to analyse the structure and functioning of political systems and processes, their elements and their historical dimension, with special emphasis on the political systems in Spain and in the European Union.

Know and be able to analyse the structure and functioning of public administrations.

Know and be able to interpret historical political and social frameworks so as to have a better understanding of current reality and future prospects; be able to manage historical documentary sources and to conduct comparative analyses of continuity and discontinuity in situations of change.

Know and know how to analyse the economic environment, the economic dimension of the public sector and the techniques of economic management of projects.

Know and know how to analyse the patterns and trends in the behaviour of collective political actors and citizens, their democratic values and fundamental rights.

Know and to know how to use the methods and techniques of quantitative and qualitative analysis, as well as the comparative method, to produce, compile, analyse and interpret qualitative and quantitative data, as well as the techniques of organisational management in public administration and of public income and expenditure.

Know how to design and analyse political strategies and campaigns and to convey political messages and information and issues of public debate.

Know the main theories and approaches of political science and public administration, as well as ideas and forms of political organisation.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS

1.Final Degree Project of an investigative nature

If the dissertation consists of a research project, it must contain at least the following elements:



- Delimitation of the object of study (justification and interest of the subject, objectives).
- Methodology and appropriate research techniques.
- Literature review and review of the state of the art in the subject under investigation.
- Data search for the field work.
- Contributions and conclusions reached and proposals, where appropriate.

2.Final Degree Project with a practical aspect.

If the dissertation has a more practical or professional application aspect, it must contain the following elements:

- Description of the factual situation.
- Description of the alternatives proposed.
- Evaluation and justification of the alternatives chosen.
- Conclusions reached and proposed solutions.

3. DFP linked to laboratories, classrooms and clinics of the Faculty of Law

The project will be integrated into these laboratories, classrooms and clinics, being developed within them and associated, where appropriate, with specific training.

E.g., in those cases in which a topic linked to the UV LegalTech Lab is offered, the TFG development will include a training period in the LegalTech Lab of the Faculty, with the aim that the student acquires the necessary skills for the development of an app, related to the object of study, which will be part of the project.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The tutor will introduce the student to the techniques of research or, where appropriate, to the preparation of a report or technical opinion on a practical case.

To this end, the tools for searching for information and bibliography on the proposed topic, the treatment and citation of the information obtained and the writing and defence of the work will be put into practice, encouraging critical and innovative approaches on the part of the student, as far as the chosen topic allows.

The monitoring of the preparation and elaboration phase of the work will be carried out through regular tutorials. In the case of field work, a system for recording and organising the information and documentation obtained, such as the portfolio, will be put into operation.

Finally, the teacher will review the written work carried out, until it is, in his/her opinion, in the necessary conditions of quality to be presented.

EVALUATION

The work must be submitted in accordance with the provisions of the [Instructions for the preparation, presentation and assessment of the TFG on the Faculty of Law](#). If the TFG is accepted for submission, the student will defend it orally before their tutor, in the manner and on the dates established in accordance with these Instructions. The lecturer will check the originality of the TFG, using the electronic plagiarism control systems provided by the University of Valencia. The verification of total or partial plagiarism will be sufficient reason to justify a failure in the TFG subject.

In the event that the work has received a grade of excellent and the tutor considers that it is eligible for an honours degree, as it is of special quality and rigour, the assessment will be submitted for examination by the TFG Tribunal, appointed by the TFG Committee.



In order to calculate the TFG grade, the tutor and, if applicable, the examining board must comply with the following percentages:

A) Attendance at tutorials 20%. Within this first part, at least the following aspects must be assessed: The search for materials, the field work carried out and the presentation of reports and drafts.

B) Completion of the work and oral presentation: 80%. In this section, the following criteria, among others, must be taken into consideration:

- The correctness of the structure and clarity in the writing of the exercise.
- Originality in the approach and results.
- Adequate methodology and research techniques (in the research work) or analysis techniques (in the practical work).
- Sufficiency in the search for data and information.
- The correct use of research tools (in the research work).
- The clarity and coherence of the oral presentation.
