SUMMARY

The course *Linguistic Historiography of Spanish* aims to study from a historiographic perspective the texts in which the codification of the Spanish language has taken shape. In order to achieve this objective, a historical tour is made through the works in which this codification has been reflected in its grammatical, orthographic and lexicographic aspects. From the knowledge of the texts, an evolution of the theoretical lines that supported their proposals and the historical context in which their publication took place is established.

In the degree program in Hispanic Studies: Spanish language and its literatures, the subject *Historiografía lingüística del español* is included in the subject *Historia de la lengua española (History of the Spanish language)*. The contents of this subject aim to achieve competent users in the recognition of the characteristics of the different stages of the history of the Spanish language, the internal evolution of its system at different levels and its codification process from a historiographical point of view.

This subject is particularly relevant to SDG 4.

6. Grammatical codification in the 18th and 19th centuries.
7. The constitution of the orthographic norm of modern Spanish.
8. The Spanish lexicography of the 18th century.

These contents will be translated into the following Learning Outcomes:

1. To be able to describe the internal and external historical evolution of the Spanish language and its codification process from a historiographical perspective.
2. To be able to identify and apply the currents and methodologies of the history and historiography of the Spanish language.
3. To be able to recognize the peculiarities of the grammatical, orthographic and lexicographic works of the different periods studied.
4. Be able to describe the theoretical lines that have supported the development of Spanish grammar from the classical models and observe the process of delatinization.
5. To be able to recognize the peculiarity of orthographic coding as opposed to grammatical coding and its reflection in the history of the orthographic coding of Spanish.
6. Be able to describe linguistic change, the periodization criteria applied to the study of the history of the Spanish language, the evolution of its graphic representation and the main changes in the evolutionary phonetics and phonology of Spanish.
7. Be able to recognize the criteria used in the process of graphic representation and orthographic fixation.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The classroom training activities will include the theoretical explanation of fundamental concepts of the subject and the practices that allow to observe the aspects of the grammatical, orthographic and lexicographic codification of the Spanish language on which the subject is focused. The classes will focus on the knowledge of this process of codification of the Spanish language from a historiographical perspective, and of the currents and methodologies of the historiography of the Spanish language, as well as the ability to interpret these codification processes from the analysis of the texts of different periods in which these processes have been reflected. The methodology will therefore be based on the following:

- 1) Theoretical contents on each of the topics of the program, according to the specific development specified in each of them, supported by the reading, prior or simultaneous to the explanations in class, of the recommended works or texts.
- 2) Practical contents with exercises of text analysis that allow to study the evolution of the grammatical, orthographic and lexicographic codification of the Spanish language.

The non-face-to-face activities include the elaboration of papers on some aspect of the historiography of the Spanish language or the preparation of the final exam. All this work involves bibliographical consultation and critical reading of representative texts on these issues, the promotion of a reflective spirit, active involvement in the process of building their grammatical knowledge, autonomous learning and the ability to discriminate bibliographical information and electronic resources related to the historiography of the Spanish language, as well as the correct preparation of oral and written texts on the historiography of the Spanish language.

In this subject innovative methodologies are put into practice from the teaching innovation project "History and historiography of the Spanish language in its didactic innovation (HISLEDIDAC)", granted by the Servei de Formació Permanent i Innovación Educativa (SFPIE), whose general objective is to design teaching-learning activities, characterized by the effective participation of students in the different subjects related to the subject "History of the Spanish language".

The Virtual Classroom will be used to provide support to the classes, as well as to keep the students informed of notices and observations on the development of the subject.

EVALUATION

The evaluation system will be based on the control of the competences that the student must acquire: historiographic knowledge about the codification process of the Spanish language in its grammatical,



orthographic and lexicographic aspects through the texts in which it has been expressed in the different periods of the Spanish language. The evaluation of learning will be carried out through a combination of a final exam and practical activities.

Regular class attendance and participation will also be taken into account, along with the recommended readings and the completion of the practical activities.

The final grade will be the sum of the grades obtained throughout the course in the previous concepts, according to the following percentages:

Type of evaluation

- a) Individual written exam: 7 points (70%)
- b) Class attendance, participation, work and practical activities: 3 points (30%)

In order to pass the course as a whole (on both first and second call), it is necessary to obtain at least 5 points.

The student has the right to pass the course in the second call. The part corresponding to the individual written exam will be recoverable in the second call (70%). It will not be recoverable in the second call the part of the remaining 30% corresponding to the work and practical activities that are carried out throughout the course.

Evaluation criteria

Theory

- Theoretical knowledge will be assessed in the final exam by means of questions in which the student will have to develop some of the issues covered during the course.

Practical activities

- The evaluation of the practicals will take into account both the resolution of a specific part of the final exam dedicated to the analysis of a text in which the codification of Spanish in some of its historical stages has been reflected, as well as the work done during the course and the participation in the commentaries of historiographical texts on the Spanish language that are presented in the classes.

Within the framework of these components of the evaluation related to practical activities, an activity directly related to the teaching innovation project mentioned in the Methodology section is foreseen, which will be based on the analysis of treatises for orthographic, grammatical and lexicographic codification, with the purpose of becoming a guide for reading and interpreting the text under study.



The evaluation system also takes into account the acquisition of skills, including writing and proofreading in Spanish. Therefore, if the person taking the exam commits spelling, orthotypography or expression mistakes, each mistake will result in a reduction of the grade obtained.

The general grading system will follow the regulations of the Universitat de València approved by the Consell de Govern on May 30, 2017. ACGUV 108/2017.
