SUMMARY

This course is part of the "TRANSLATION PRACTICE" module, which constitutes (with 72 credits) the practical core of the Translation and Interlinguistic Mediation studies. Within this module, there are several subjects: GENERAL TRANSLATION (30 credits), SPECIALIZED TRANSLATION (18 credits), INTERPRETATION (12 credits) and KNOWLEDGE OF THE PROFESSIONAL ENVIRONMENT (12 credits).

The subject 'Specialized Translation language B (German) 1/A Spanish-Catalan' is the first of the three that make up the subject Specialized Translation and its main objective is to familiarize students with some of the textual typologies typical of this field, as well as to optimize the resources acquired in the subjects of General Translation in order to be able to apply them adequately to the translation of specialized texts.

This course promotes UNESCO's Sustainable Development Goals by addressing cross-cutting issues related to some of them in the tasks of translation, analysis and discussion of texts. In particular, it takes into account SDG 5, in order to contribute to ending all forms of discrimination against women in the classroom and in society, and SDG 10, specifically in terms of reducing inequalities that may arise in the classroom due to disparate income or other baseline inequalities.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS

1. Introduction to specialized texts.

Topic 1 provides an introduction to the general characteristics of specialized languages in comparison with non-specialized languages. Emphasis is placed on the determination of specialty languages, their classifications and functions.

2. Translation of administrative texts.

Topic 2 focuses on the translation of texts in which the social character is predominant and, specifically, on administrative texts. These include rental contracts, contracts of sale and purchase and service contracts.

3. Translation of institutional and political texts.

Theme 3 is devoted to the translation of institutional and political texts. Examples of these are texts related to public and/or private organizations, such as transcripts, articles of incorporation and speeches related to political activities.

4. Translation of legal texts.

Theme 4 deals with the translation of legal and sworn texts. Special attention is given to family law, with texts related to divorce, custody and/or inheritance proceedings, and labor law.

5. Translation project.

Topic 5 is developed throughout the course in a cross-cutting manner and focuses on the management and development of a translation project. Emphasis is placed on the various roles involved in managing a translation project efficiently and successfully achieving the final product.



LEARNING OUTCOMES:

Assess and understand the application of different translation standards according to different socio-cultural contexts.

Distinguish and make appropriate use of different translation techniques.

Value the differences between language systems and language use for the purposes of translation practice and interlinguistic mediation.

Make decisions and evaluate them critically in translation or communicative mediation tasks.

Mastery of the most relevant auxiliary means depending on the type of texts to be translated, especially those related to new information and communication technologies, and those related to documentation and the use or elaboration of lexicographic and terminological bases.

Knowledge and appreciation of intercultural differences related to the subject areas to be translated.

To know and understand, from within the scope of the degree, the inequalities based on sex and gender in society; to integrate the different needs and preferences based on sex and gender in the design of solutions and problem solving.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY

The training activities foreseen include, in their face-to-face component, classes of an eminently practical nature, in which the following will be carried out:

- translation exercises of the proposed texts;
- computer-assisted translation in a multimedia environment;
- the use of databases and terminologies;
- bilingual expertise in one or more fields of specialization.

This course will also include team work, called translation project, in which students will assume different roles: translator, documentalist, terminologist, editor and proofreader. Priority will be given to the formation of work groups in which native speakers of languages A and B are present.
