SUMMARY

The subject, in the 1st year, is part of the module Literature and culture in language B (taught in the 1st and 2nd years). It is an optional subject, but compulsory for the French major. Specifically, this subject: 'Introduction to literary texts in French', is a first approach of the students of the degree in the competences and contents that will be the subject of the subject 'Commentary of literary texts in French literature'. It proposes the presentation and application of commentary methods to different literary texts in the B language by different authors, genres and periods of the 19th and 20th centuries. The aim of this subject is to increase the ability to read, interpret and critically analyse works written in the literature studied, in their original language. It encourages the application of methods of approaching the text and operative concepts of literary criticism. Increases the ability to develop in writing and present in language B a critical and synthetic reflection on aspects of the literature studied, applying terms specific to literary studies. Reinforces communicative competences in language B.

TEACHING METHODOLOGY



Presentation of the fundamental concepts necessary for the knowledge and study of literary texts of different genres, authors and works of the subject by means of the expository method. Participation of students, individually or in groups, through the commentary of proposed texts. Individual or group exercises of reading and critical analysis of the works studied and the proposed texts. Debate and reflection exercises.

EVALUATION

- a) 1 text commentary (35%) on the official exam date.
- b) 3 theoretical-practical exercises (15% each exercise) related to the contents of the course syllabus. The date will be communicated by the teaching staff during the course.
- c) Control (20%) on the readings of texts indicated by the teacher.

The final grade will be the average of the exercises, if the grade for each of the blocks (a, b and c) is 5/10. Exercises a) and c) may be made up. In addition, students will have to take 1 theoretical practical test related to the contents of the course syllabus (45%). Class attendance and active participation during the classes may count up to 0.5 in the different parts of the course.

Intellectual honesty is vital in academic communities, and for the fair evaluation of students' work. All work submitted for this course must be original. Papers that make use of fraudulent collaboration or composition with the help of artificial intelligence (ChatGPT or others) will not be accepted, except if their use is part of the contents of the subject and is authorised by the teaching staff.
