## SUMMARY

1 Subject for access to the Minor in "Portuguese Language and its Literatures" included in the Module "General Philological Training", in the Subject "Literature" (6 ECTS credits, 2nd year, 2nd semester). This Module also includes, in the Subject "Language", the subject "Portuguese Language I" (6 ECTS credits, 2nd



year, 1st semester).

2 It is a compulsory subject in the Basic Training module of the philological degrees that is offered together with other second language literature on an optional basis.

3 This subject will address the study and analysis of the main literary movements and authors of literature in Portuguese from the medieval to the classical period: historical context, characterization of genres and themes, representative authors, outstanding works.

4 In *Portuguese Literature (2nd Language)*, students will begin their learning of Portuguese literature with a comprehensive approach that will not only allow them to develop basic critical and literary skills, but also contribute to their personal and social well-being, in line with the Development Goals. Sustainable Development Goals (SDG) of the UN.

This subject contributes to the following Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs): SDG 3: "Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages", SDG 4: "Ensure inclusive, equitable and quality education and promote opportunities of lifelong learning for all" and SDG 5: "Gender equality".

This course is designed so that students not only learn basic knowledge of Portuguese literature, but also form themselves as conscious global citizens committed to the principles of sustainability and equity.

## TEACHING METHODOLOGY

**A) Face-to-face learning activities:** the face-to-face teaching consists of two weekly sessions (4 hours) that combine theoretical explanations with oral and written practice, which will complement and reinforce the theoretical classes.

**1) Theoretical classes:** on each one of the subjects of the programme, following the specific development specified for each one of them in the syllabus. The teacher will expose the essential contents and explain the way in which they should be approached by the students.

**2) Practical classes:** reading, explanation, commentary and analysis of medieval and classic texts of Portuguese literature, thus contributing to the assimilation of linguistic and communication skills and the development of oral and written comprehension of the language under study through exercises appropriate to the regard.

Other activities:

**Tutorials** to resolve doubts that may arise both in theoretical and practical classes, as well as to guide the completion of work or activities related to the contents of the course.

**B) Non face-to-face learning activities:** independent study and work aimed at preparing for classes and exams.

This course is part of the Teaching Innovation Project "Resonating with ECO Beyond the Classroom", under the SFPIE 2025-2026 call. This project is a continuation of the Teaching Innovation Project "ECO, SDGs, and Entrepreneurship from the Arabic Minor," no. 3309414, from the SFPIE 2024-2025 call for teaching projects.

## EVALUATION

The evaluation will consist of two different parts (1st and 2nd call):

The note obtained in part B will be valid for both calls. Non-recoverable activity.

In this subject, the oral or written evaluation tests (exams, individual work, text analysis, reading control or others) will be used to assess the assimilation of theoretical and practical knowledge of Portuguese literature, the acquisition of the required skills and the progressive development communication skills in the Portuguese language.

The written exam will consist of two parts:

- 1) Questions for development and critical reflection on the topics, genres, works and authors explained in class.
- 2) Reading control: questions about compulsory reading books.

#### Evaluation criteria

##### *Theory*

- Critical and bibliographical knowledge of the main genres, literary movements, works and authors of medieval and classical Portuguese literature.
- Assimilation of the contents of compulsory reading books.

##### *Practices*

- Ability to read, interpret and analyze works of medieval and classical Portuguese literature translated or in their original language as the acquisition and development of communication skills allow.
- Ability to develop in writing a critical, reasoned and synthetic reflection on themes, genres, literary movements, authors and works of medieval and classical Portuguese literature.
- Reinforcement of communication skills in the Portuguese language.
