TEACHING METHODOLOGY



Theoretical classes:

Theoretical classes will be based on the professor's expositions, which will deal with both theoretical, procedural and substantive aspects of the different Spanish sectorial public policies, emphasizing the more technical and complex aspects, less susceptible to individual work. The explanations will deliberately encourage the critical analysis of the contents, trying to establish comparisons of the original ideas with present situations. For which the active and informed participation of the students will be requested, which will have its reflection to the final grade.

Practical classes:

The practical classes will be dedicated in a preferential way to the elaboration of the team work, the evolution of which the teacher will supervise weekly. Eventually, the practical classes may be devoted to analyze and comment texts and/or audiovisual materials referring to specific documents of the various sectorial policies. Finally, complementary activities may consist of workshops, seminars, conferences, etc.

EVALUATION

The evaluation of the course consists of two elements, both in the first and in the second call:

a) *Exam:* at the end of the course there will be a final test on all the contents of the course included in this teaching guide, whether they have been taught in the classroom or not, and the materials covered in the various sessions. This test will have a value of 60% of the overall grade.

b) *Continuous evaluation:* Throughout the semester practical work and complementary activities of different nature will be done, which will have to be delivered on the day indicated by the teacher. This part will have a value of up to 40% of the final grade. In order for the student to obtain points for the continuous evaluation, he/she must have attended a minimum of 75% of the class sessions dedicated to this subject.

In addition, in order to add the qualificació obtained in the continuous evaluation (of the practical sessions) to the qualificació in the exam, the student must have obtained at least a 4 (out of 10) in this final exam. The content of all these works of continuous evaluation also constitute materials and contents of the course, so they are likely to be part of the final exam. The professor will explain how each exercise has to be performed and delivered and, subsequently, will deliver the results of the various practices before the exam. The practicals (whether they are not completed or handed in within the stipulated deadline, or those already completed or evaluated) cannot be recovered after the date of delivery, nor for the second call (keeping for this the grade of the successful continuous evaluation throughout the semester).

Regardless of the general assessment system established for all students (written or oral exam), the lecturers responsible for the subject may determine in the appendix to the teaching guide the possibility of changing the final exam modality when they are forced to hold the exam on a date other than the official



one in application of the rules established for the case of coincidence of exams in the Regulations for Assessment and Grading of the Undergraduate and Master's Degrees of the University of Valencia, or any other regulatory cause established (e.g. justified force majeure). gr. cases of justified force majeure). In these cases, the new type of exam to be taken must maintain the same level of demand and difficulty as the one taken in general for the rest of the group

Students who have followed the continuous assessment and have been assessed, in the event of not taking the final exam on the official exam date (both in the 1st and 2nd call), will obtain the grade of NOT PRESENTED.
