**SUMMARY**

An approach to contemporary reflection on history in its ontological, methodological, epistemological and practical-political dimensions. Modernity gave birth to a new concept of history (Geschichte) that integrated the objective dimension of events (rerum gestarum), on the one hand, and the narrative dimension through which they are represented and accounted for in terms of meaning for human experience (Historie), on the other. As a debtor of this modern concept, contemporary thought reflected, on the one hand, on the consequences of the new concept in the configuration of a new experience of time and, on the other, raised a whole series of questions and aporias linked to the existing relationship between the two dimensions that this concept integrates: the referential or objective dimension and the narrative or linguistic dimension through which the former is mediated, that is, identified, articulated and represented. In the scrutiny of such a relationship, one cannot abstract from the ontological, epistemological, moral and even aesthetic preconceptions that are used, more or less consciously, for this purpose. The course will be open to the different traditions and the most relevant contributions on this wide and varied subject (problems, worldviews, terms, concepts, ideas, metaphors, symbols, icons, constellations, discourses, ideologies, stories, poetics, antinomies...).

Students should apply acquired knowledge to solve problems in unfamiliar contexts within their field of study, including multidisciplinary scenarios.

Students should communicate conclusions and underlying knowledge clearly and unambiguously to both specialized and non-specialized audiences.

Students should demonstrate self-directed learning skills for continued academic growth.

## **DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS**

In addition to what is stated in general terms in the SUMMARY section, and given that different historical-conceptual approaches will be given priority in the treatment of the subject, the questions that will be dealt with in greater depth in the 2025-26 academic year will be some of the following:



- Genealogy and Taxonomy of Conceptual History: methodological keys, affections and disaffections with other historiographical approaches and philosophical and cultural turns (ontological, epistemological, linguistic, iconic, rhetorical,...). Theoretical-practical links with the emergence, metamorphosis and crisis of modernity. Attempts to renew and update the lexicons of modernity and the present.
- Philosophical hermeneutics (Dilthey, Heidegger) and Gadamer's principle of conservation. Truth and Method and Critical Theories.
- Conceptual and Historical History (Reinhart Koselleck): Modern concept of history. Principle of optimisation of modernity. Ideology of Acceleration (Harmut Rosa).
- Historical Semantics and Political Iconology. Poetics and Hermeneutics: Blumenberg's Metaphorology.
- Traditionalism of modernity (positivisation of the Hegelian split) and the compensation principle of the Joachim Ritter School: Odo Marquard and Hermann Lübbe.
- Republicanism and the Contextual Turn in the History of Ideas: Theory and Method in Quentin Skinner and J. G. A. Pocock.
- Alternatively, some sessions will be devoted to the presentation and discussion, by invited specialists, of recent and novel research on the thematic field of the course: e.g. Italian contributions to the configuration of the triad history, concept and event (Padua Group), constellation analysis and the history of precarious knowledge (D. Henrich, M. Frank and M. Mulsow), analysis of Spanish casuistry, Psychoanalysis and History of Concepts, ...
