SUMMARY

The Master's Thesis (TFM) is a research project in which the student must identify a topic, a problem or a question of philosophical interest, delimit a relevant bibliography that allows him/her to draw a "state of the question": a presentation of the most important aspects, problems or theories in the specialized literature that should be taken into account when dealing with the chosen topic, and defend in this context an original thesis supported by reasons through an argumentative text. In this task, students will have the support and guidance of a member of the Master's faculty with whom they can agree on the topic of their dissertation.

DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS



Each student will propose a topic and title to a professor of the Master who can tutor him/her. If the tutor agrees, the proposal will be submitted to the CCA for ratification. It is the function of the faculty who direct master dissertations to help their students to specify the topic, organize the work and use the relevant sources accordingly.

The length of the Master's dissertation should be between 22.000 and 28.000 words, not including bibliographical references. It must meet the formal conditions of an academic paper in terms of grammatical correctness and rigor of expression. The citation system and the bibliography must follow one of the standardized systems. Students will comply with other formal requirements that the CCA will publish each year on the specific web site of the degree: <https://www.uv.es/mpfc> (in the menu tab corresponding to the "TFM").

The dissertation cannot consist of a mere summary of the works consulted for its realization. It will have thematic unity and will respond to a reasoned and critical elaboration. The clarity of the exposition, the rigor in the argumentation and the originality will be central factors in the evaluation of the work.
