SUMMARY

The Legal Framework course is a compulsory subject worth 6 ECTS credits. Together with Prevention Management, Related Techniques and Other Actions, it forms part of the module "Specific Areas of Prevention", one of the preventive disciplines that provide the foundation for the different occupational risk prevention approaches in the workplace.

This course aims to provide students with a comprehensive understanding of the employer's obligation to prevent occupational risks. Starting from the relevant legal and regulatory framework and its main characteristics, the course analyses each of the obligations that make up this duty, highlighting the different parties involved, the specific measures that must be implemented, and the various liabilities that may arise from non-compliance.



Upon successful completion of the course, students will have acquired sufficient knowledge to address the specific areas of occupational risk prevention that they choose to pursue in greater depth.
