## DESCRIPTION OF CONTENTS

The student must demonstrate that he or she has acquired the necessary skills and knows how to apply the methodological and interpretive resources. The work will be based on documentary and bibliographic sources and must have a minimum length of 50 pages (at 2,100 characters per page).
