

**M<sup>a</sup> Camino Bueno Alastuey** holds a PhD in English Philology from the University of the Basque Country and is Associate Professor in the area of applied linguistics at the Public University of Navarre. After teaching English for Specific Purposes in a variety of degrees (Nursing, Agricultural engineering, Computer Sciences etc.), she currently teaches ICT Applied to the Teaching of Foreign Languages both in the BA Degree in Primary and Early Childhood Teacher Education and in the Master of Secondary Education Teacher Training.

Her **research** activity has focused on the study of ICT applied to the teaching of languages, especially the design and analysis of curricular interventions, and teacher training using ICT, mainly on the development of oral and written skills in class, techno-pedagogical skills, and the integration of technology into CLIL units and projects. She has participated in 7 research projects about those topics and has numerous publications, including a book, a journal monograph and articles in high-impact journals indexed in SSCI and SJR. She has an h-index of 15, i10 of 22 and 1126 citations in Google Scholar, and an h-index of 10 and 376 citations in Web of Science and Scopus. She has delivered more than 40 presentations at conferences, and five of them have been keynotes or invited.

She has **supervised** two doctoral theses and co-directed another, and has four in progress (two of them with predoctoral grants from the Government of Navarra and the UPNA). She has also supervised 15 Final Degree projects and 37 Master's Projects. Finally, she is a usual reviewer for several high impact journals included in the JCR or SJR. Since 2016, she has been editor of the journal Huarte de San Juan. Philology and Didactics of Language (DIALNET) and since 2024 she has been Associate Editor of the journal System (SJR Q1).

In the field of **Management**, she has been Academic Secretary of the Department of Philology and Language Teaching from 2010 to 2018, Vice-Dean of the Degree of Teacher in Primary Education and of the Joint Honors Degree (2020-2024) and is currently the director of the Department of Human Sciences and Education. Furthermore, she was elected member of the Board of the Faculty of Human and Social Sciences since 2012, Member of the University Senate (2007 – Present), Member of the Works Council (2005 – 2017) and member of the Board of the PDI (2019 – present). He has also been a member of the university's Governing Council (2015-2017). She

Regarding **internationalisation**, she has been invited to do research stays and has participated in research projects at the University of Tucson (USA), the University of California (USA), the Jagiellonian University (Poland), the University of Galway (Ireland), the University of Cambridge (Great Britain) and Texas Tech University (USA). She has also been responsible for different student mobility programs and is currently IP responsible at the UPNA for the Erasmus A+ Strategic Partnerships project "Teachers of English for Future Europe (TEFE): EU mobility and employability project" (2023-2026), a continuation of the previous TEFE project (2021-2023).
