



Indications for outgoing exchange students (Erasmus, SICUE and International Programme) who take part in international mobility programmes at the Universitat de València during the 2020-21 academic year

Information update of 7 September, 2020 (This information may vary depending on the circumstances)

The general recommendation for mobility students is to continue with their mobility plans for the 2020-21 academic year. We are working in a scenario of maximum flexibility to adapt mobility programmes to the current circumstances.

For Erasmus stays, depending on the country and the host university, lessons may be in-class, distance lessons or blended, but financial aid will only be received in the event that the student has physically has to the host university. Therefore, aid will be received in all teaching modalities for as long as the student remains abroad. Under no circumstances will financial scholarships be received without travelling abroad.

For academic matters related to the stays, the corresponding Coordinators and Mobility Coordinators will tutor the outgoing students in the management of their study contracts.

The Universitat de València will not cover the expenses or carry out PCR tests before the incorporation of the students to the host university, or upon their return.

It is very important to visit the European Union informative website on travel conditions within Europe. Through [RE OPEN EU](#) website, you will be able to find out any travel restrictions within Europe. It is also highly recommended to visit the website of the [Ministerio de Asuntos Exteriores](#) website and follow the instructions mentioned there. You must have the contact of the corresponding Spanish consular office.

According to the information provided in the previous paragraph, in the event that outgoing students must keep a quarantine upon arrival at the host universities, it is recommended to know in advance the conditions of the residence or accommodation during the quarantine period.

This card allows the beneficiary to have access to the European national health systems under the same conditions as the nationals of those European countries. If you have arranged medical and travel insurance with an insurance company, which is highly recommended, you should consult how to use it and know the benefits.

You must remain very attentive to the communications that you may receive both from the Universitat de València and from the host university.
