



Advice to incoming exchange students about the academic year 2021-22

(Erasmus, International Programme and SICUE incoming students)

From the start of next academic year on 13th, September 2021 we want educational activities to take place face-to-face on campus as much as possible, supplemented if necessary with online classes. This of course, will depend on the pandemic evolution, always guaranteeing everyone's safety and achieving quality education.

We recommend students to attend in person from 13th September in order to follow the classes and carry out the administrative procedures established by the mobility programmes. Therefore, it is not advisable to delay arrival at the Universitat de València so as not to miss in-class lessons, which could undermine the development of the subject. Likewise, bear in mind that the Erasmus scholarship exclusively covers the periods of effective stay at the host university, that is, physical mobility.

Our university has prepared contingency plans if health circumstances worsen. If necessary, appropriate measures would be applied so that courses and exams are taken online so as not to cause any harm to our students.

To guide the students, the Universitat de València will organise an <u>online</u> <u>welcome session</u> for all incoming students coming the first semester. It will be an interactive session that will take place on **9 September at 11 a.m.**

During their stays, students will have the support of the International Relations Service, as well as the International Offices of the Faculties where teaching is provided. For academic matters, tutoring will be provided by the mobility coordinators of the degrees.







To protect your health, the Government of Spain has implemented a series of measures, including health control of passengers upon arrival in Spain. From this website https://www.spth.gob.es you can fill out the health control form and obtain your QR Code, to show it at the control points upon arrival in Spain.

It is convenient for incoming students to consult in official sources the information on trips to Spain and health alerts: https://ir.uv.es/aN3TEOP and that they have medical insurance that covers them in all circumstances that now must include COVID-19.

In case teaching will follow a hybrid model, we recommend to have your own computer and access to Wi-Fi at your residence in Valencia to be able to follow the classes properly; in the facilities of the Universitat de València you will have Wi-Fi coverage through the Eduroam network.
