

## BIPs CALL 2026–2027

### FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

---

#### What are BIPs-BIMs?

BIPs (Blended Intensive Programmes) and BIMs (Blended Intensive Mobilities) are Erasmus+ mobilities that allows students to undertake a short-term physical stay at a foreign university, combined with a virtual learning component in collaboration with other international students.

These mobility formats are especially aimed at students who, for personal, academic, or financial reasons, cannot participate in a long-term mobility but still wish to gain international experience.

BIPs and BIMs promote teamwork, the exchange of knowledge and cultures, and the development of digital and communication skills. Each BIP must be organised by a consortium of at least three universities from three different EU countries and involve a minimum of 15 participating students.

#### Who can participate?

Students officially enrolled in **undergraduate or doctoral** studies at the University of Valencia may participate, both at the time of application and during the stay.

Students participating in another long-term mobility programme (such as Erasmus studies, internships, SICUE, or international mobility) or those who have already received a short-term Erasmus grant in the same academic year may not participate.

In addition, students must not exceed the maximum duration of **12 months per study cycle** within the Erasmus+ programme, except for degrees with special conditions (such as Medicine, Pharmacy, and Dentistry). For these three degree programmes, the maximum duration will be 24 months.

#### What is the duration of the stays?

The physical stay must last between **5 and 30 days** and take place between **1 August 2026 and 15 July 2027**. This is complemented by a virtual learning phase before, during, or after the physical stay, with no minimum or maximum duration.

This combination provides an international experience that is accessible, flexible, and aligned with European priorities in digitalisation, inclusion, and sustainability.

### What financial support is offered?

Students will receive an individual grant of **79 euros per day**, up to a maximum of 7 days, totalling **553 euros**. This includes:

- 5 days of in-person academic activity: **395 euros**
- 2 additional days for standard travel: **158 euros**

In addition, fixed travel grants are awarded based on the distance between Valencia and the destination, ranging from **211 euros to 1,735 euros**, according to the EU's official table.

There is also an additional grant for those who choose **eco-friendly travel** (by train, bus, or shared car), and a comprehensive insurance policy is included in the grant.

**Students with fewer opportunities** — such as those receiving a general grant, having a recognised disability of 33% or more, belonging to a large or single-parent family, being victims of gender-based violence or terrorism, or having refugee status or having applied for international protection — **will receive an additional 100-euro grant** for the entire mobility.

### How do I apply?

Applications must be submitted through the official Mobility Online platform at the following link:

Once the application is completed, it is mandatory to upload Annex II to the platform, signed by both the student and the academic responsible for the BIP.

No other documents need to be submitted, as the university will verify eligibility automatically.

### What are the application deadlines?

There are four application periods, subject to available funding:

- **From the day following the official publication date until 10 July 2026**
- **From 5 to 23 October 2026**
- **From 18 January to 5 February 2027**
- **From 15 to 30 April 2027**

Each period includes a starting date from which the mobility may begin.

### What criteria apply if there are more applicants than places?

If there are more applicants than available places, selection will be based on competitive merit.

- For undergraduate students: the average academic record up to the 2025–2026 academic year will be considered.
- For doctoral students: the average grade from the studies that granted access to the doctoral programme will be considered.

Each BIP can accept a maximum of **10 students from the University of Valencia**, so academic merit is essential in the selection process.

---

### What documentation must be submitted?

The only required document is **Annex II**, signed by the applicant and the BIP coordinator at the University of Valencia.

The University will verify registration, grades, and other requirements automatically. Failure to submit a properly completed Annex II will result in disqualification.

---

### What obligations does the selected student have?

Selected students must:

- Sign the Learning Agreement
- Sign the Grant Agreement
- Obtain the European Health Insurance Card
- Actively participate in all BIP activities
- Comply with the rules of the host university
- Submit the certificate of attendance
- Complete the final student report
- Arrange academic recognition

Failure to comply with these obligations may result in the loss of the grant and the obligation to reimburse the funds received.
