





Among other objectives the Garden maintains a scientific collection of live plants, preserving a historic legacy of continuous cultivation, which includes monumental trees and historical buildings.

The Botanical Garden is located at Quart st, 80 and you can easily get there by tube lines 3 or 5 from the airport. It just takes 30 min. The nearest stop is called "Angel Guimerá", and the Garden is just 7 min walking.

HOW TO GET TO/FROM THE AIRPORT

By **metro**, via Line 3 (red) and Line 5 (green). The station is situated on the ground floor of the arrivals hall in the Regional Terminal. Journey time to the city centre is approximately 25 minutes.

By **bus**, via metropolitan bus line 150, also known as the Airport Metrobus. This stops just outside the T1 arrivals hall.

By **taxi**. There are two taxi ranks, one in T1 Departures (first floor) and the other in T1 Arrivals (ground floor). València's taxis are white and run by local companies. They all charge the same rates and are available 24 hours a day. The cost will be around 20 to 25 €. All of them already have a dataphone to pay by card.

GOOD TO KNOW

Covid-19 restrictions

From February the 10th, the wearing of face masks when outside will no longer be mandatory. However, their use will still be required at large outdoor events where attendees are standing. Or if when seated it is not possible to maintain the safety distance of 1.5 m (except in the case of members of the same household).

COVID certificate to access hospitality, restaurant, leisure and entertainment facilities

All persons aged 12 and over must present a vaccination certificate, diagnostic test or COVID-19 recovery certificate together with an identity document or passport to enter the following establishments, where masks are required:

• Hotel, restaurant, and nightlife establishments, regardless of their capacity.

• All places where the mask cannot be worn permanently, such as events where food and/or drink services are provided, catering services in public places or places open to the public, etc.

Events and celebrations where masks cannot always be worn.

These restrictions may change from the 28th of February on.

Entry requirements depending on the country from which you are travelling.

Travellers from the European Union or European Economic Area

You must present one of these required certificates:

a) **Vaccination certificate**: issued by the competent authorities in the country of origin beginning 14 days after the administration date of the last dose required to be fully vaccinated. The accepted vaccines shall be those authorized by the European Medicines Agency or those which have undergone the World Health Organization emergency use process.

b) A diagnostic certificate: Diagnostic test certificates for active COVID-19 infection with a negative result belonging to one of the following types will be accepted as valid:

Security measures for entry into Spain

It is compulsory to fill in this Health Control Form which can be accessed from the page spth.gob.es or by downloading the app on your mobile phone from the same page. The Spanish airports have incorporated three security filters for passengers: temperature, in a very efficient and high rigour process; a documentary control, based on the responsible declarations with health information that allows the traceability or the follow up of the person; and also a visual control When the form is completed, a personal QR code is generated. Travellers must present this to carriers before boarding, as well as at health checkpoints at the point of entry into Spain
