ACCOMODATION AND PRACTICAL INFORMATION

• HOW TO GET TO/FROM THE AIRPORT

By **metro:** Line 3 (red) and Line 5 (green). The station is situated on the ground floor -arrivals hall in the Regional Terminal. To the city centre it takes approximately 25 minutes.

By **bus:** via metropolitan bus, line 150, also known as the *Airport Metrobus*. The bus stop is outside the T1 arrivals hall.

By **taxi**; There are two taxi stands, one in T1 Departures (first floor) and the other in T1 Arrivals (ground floor). València's taxis are white and managed by local companies. They all charge the same rates and are available 24 hours a day. The cost to the city centre will be around 20 to 25 €. All of them already have a dataphone to pay by card.

València is a bike-friendly city perfect to take a pleasant ride. The city, which belongs to the Network of Cycling Cities, has over 156 kilometres of cycle paths and is home to the old riverbed of the Turia River, a garden that cuts through the urban heart of the city that you can visit by bike without any rush, whilst enjoying a year-round pleasant climate. The flatness of the ground and the conditions of the historical centre, where vehicles traffic is restricted, are some other reasons for enjoying a bike ride in Valencia.
