



## Advice to incoming exchange students about the academic year 2021-22

*(Erasmus, International Programme and SICUE incoming students)*

From the start of the next academic year on **13 September 2021** we would like educational activities to **take place face-to-face on campus** as much as possible, supplemented if **necessary with online classes**. This of course, will depend on the evolution of the pandemic to always guarantee everyone's safety and achieve quality education.

We recommend that students attend in-person from 13 September in order to follow the classes and carry out the administrative procedures established by the mobility programmes. Therefore, **it is not advisable to delay arrival at the University of Valencia so as not to miss in-class lectures**, which could hinder the development of subjects. Likewise, bear in mind that the Erasmus grant only covers the periods of the actual stay at the host university, that is, physical mobility.

Our university has prepared contingency plans if health circumstances worsen. If necessary, appropriate measures will be applied so that courses and exams are taken online so as not to cause any harm to our students.

To guide students, the University of Valencia will organise an [online welcome session](#) for all incoming students coming for the first semester. It will be an interactive session that will take place on **9 September at 11 a.m.**

During their stays, students will have the support of the International Relations Service, as well as the International Offices of the faculties where teaching is provided. For academic matters, tutoring will be provided by the degree mobility coordinators.



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To protect your health, the Government of Spain has implemented a series of measures, including health controls for passengers upon arrival in Spain. On the website <https://www.spth.gob.es>, you can fill out the health control form and obtain your QR Code, to show it at the control points upon arrival in Spain.

Incoming students are advised to consult official sources for information on trips to Spain and health alerts: <https://ir.uv.es/aN3TEOP> and have medical insurance that covers them in all circumstances, which must now include COVID-19.

If teaching follows a hybrid model, we recommend having your own computer and access to Wi-Fi at your residence in Valencia to be able to follow the classes properly. You will have Wi-Fi coverage through the Eduroam network in the facilities of the University of Valencia.
